15	TO AMEND PROVISIONS IN THE JUVENILE CODE
16	CONCERNING THE PLACEMENT OF JUVENILES.
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 9-27-355 is amended to read as follows:
22	9-27-355. Placement of juveniles.
23	(a) The court shall not specify a particular provider for placement of
24	any <u>a</u> foster child.
25	(b)(1) A relative of a juvenile placed in the custody of the
26	Department of Human Services shall be given preferential consideration for
27	placement if the relative caregiver meets all relevant child protection
28	standards and it is in the best interest of the juvenile to be placed with
29	the relative caregiver.
30	(b)(1)(A) When the Department of Human Services takes custody of a
31	juvenile under § 12-18-1001, or when the court determines that a juvenile
32	shall be removed from his or her home under this subchapter, the department
33	shall conduct an immediate assessment to locate:
34	(i) A noncustodial parent of the juvenile;
35	(ii) Recommended relatives of the juvenile,
36	including each grandparent of the juvenile, and all parents of the juvenile's

1	sibling if the parent has custody of the sibling; and
2	(iii) Fictive kin identified by the juvenile as one
3	(1) or more persons who play or have a significant positive role in his or
4	her life.
5	(B)(i) If there is a safety issue identified from a Child
6	Maltreatment Central Registry check or criminal background check, the
7	department is not required to provide further assessment or notice to the
8	persons identified under subdivision (b)(1)(A) of this section.
9	(ii) If there is not a safety issue identified in a
10	Child Maltreatment Central Registry check or criminal background check
11	regarding all the persons identified under subdivision (b)(l)(A) of this
12	section, the department shall provide, in writing, to the persons identified
13	the following notice:
14	(a) A statement saying that the juvenile
15	has been or is being removed from his or her parent;
16	(b) An explanation concerning how to
17	participate and be considered for care, placement, and visitation with the
18	juvenile;
19	(c) Information needed for a child
20	welfare safety check and home study, if the person is interested in
21	placement;
22	(d) Information about provisional
23	relative foster care, fictive kin, and other supportive benefits available
24	through the department;
25	(e) A statement saying that failure to
26	timely respond may result in the loss of opportunities to be involved in the
27	care, placement, and visitation with the juvenile; and
28	(f) The name, number, email, and
29	physical address of the caseworker and supervisor assigned to the case.
30	(C) If the court has not transferred custody to a
31	noncustodial parent, relative, or other individual, or the department has not
32	placed the juvenile in provisional relative placement or fictive kin
33	placement, the department shall continue its assessment under subdivision
34	(b)(1)(A) of this section and subdivision (b)(1)(B) of this section
35	throughout the case.
36	(D) The department shall provide upon request of the

1	court, parties to the proceeding, or counsel for the parties to the
2	proceeding a record of the efforts made to locate the non-custodial parent,
3	relatives, fictive kin, or other persons identified under subdivision
4	(b)(l)(A) of this section and the results of the assessment, including the
5	following information concerning the identified person:
6	(i) Name;
7	(ii) Last known address and phone number;
8	(iii) The appropriateness of placement based
9	on the department's assessment of the person; and
10	(iv) Other identifying or relevant information
11	to the extent known by the department.
12	(E)(i) A relative or fictive kin identified by the
13	department under subdivision (b)(l)(A) of this section shall be given
14	preferential consideration for placement if the relative or fictive kin meets
15	all relevant protective standards and it is in the best interest of the
16	juvenile to be placed with the relative or fictive kin.
17	(ii) In all placements, preferential consideration
18	for a relative or fictive kin shall be given at all stages of the case.
19	(iii) If the court denies placement with a relative
20	or fictive kin, the court shall make specific findings of fact in writing
21	regarding the considerations given to the relative or fictive kin and the
22	reasons the placement was denied.
23	(iv) The court shall not base its decision to place
24	the juvenile solely upon the consideration of the relationship formed between
25	the juvenile and a foster parent.
26	(F) The court may transfer custody to any relative or any
27	other person recommended by the department, the parent, or any party upon
28	review of a home study, including criminal background and child maltreatment
29	reports, and a finding that custody is in the best interest of the child.
30	(2) Placement or custody of a juvenile in the home of a relative.
31	fictive kin, or other person shall not relieve the department of its
32	responsibility to actively implement the goal of the case.
33	(3)(A) The juvenile shall remain in a licensed or approved
34	foster home, shelter, or facility or an exempt child welfare agency as
35	defined at under \S 9-28-402(12) until the home is opened as a regular foster
36	home, as a provisional foster home if the person is a relative to one (1) of

1 the children in the sibling group, including step-siblings, or the court 2 grants custody of the juvenile to the relative, fictive kin, or other person 3 after a written approved home study is presented to the court. 4 (B) For placement only with a relative or fictive kin: 5 The juvenile and the juvenile's siblings or 6 step-siblings may be placed in the home of a relative or fictive kin on a 7 provisional basis for up to six (6) months pending the relative or fictive 8 kin's home being opened as a regular foster home; 9 (ii) If the relative or fictive kin opts to have his 10 or her home opened as a provisional foster home, the relative or fictive kin 11 shall not be paid a board payment until the relative or fictive kin meets all 12 of the requirements and his or her home is opened as a regular foster home; 13 (iii) Until the relative or fictive kin's home is 14 opened as a regular foster home, the relative or fictive kin may: 15 (a) Apply for and receive benefits that the 16 relative or fictive kin may be entitled to due to the placement of the 17 juvenile in the home, such as benefits under the Transitional Employment 18 Assistance Program, § 20-76-401, and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance 19 Program (SNAP); and 20 (b) Receive child support or any federal 21 benefits paid on behalf of the juvenile in the relative or fictive kin's 22 home; and (iv) If the relative or fictive kin's home is not 23 24 fully licensed as a foster home after six (6) months of the placement of the 25 juvenile and the siblings or step-siblings in the home: 26 (a) The department shall remove the juvenile 27 and any of the siblings or step-siblings from the relative or fictive kin's 28 home and close the relative or fictive kin's provisional foster home; or 29 (b) The court shall remove custody from the department and grant custody of the juvenile to the relative or fictive kin 30 31 subject to the limitations outlined in subdivision (b)(4) of this section. 32 (4) If the court grants custody of the juvenile and any siblings or step-siblings to the relative, fictive kin, or other person: 33 34 (A)(i) The juvenile and any siblings or step-siblings shall not be 35 placed back in the custody of the department while remaining in the home of

the relative, fictive kin, or other person.

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1 (ii) The juvenile and any siblings or step-siblings shall not be 2 removed from the custody of the relative, fictive kin, or other person, 3 placed in the custody of the department, and then remain or be returned to 4 the home of the relative, fictive kin, or other person while remaining in the 5 custody of the department; 6 (B) The relative, fictive kin, or other person shall not 7 receive any financial assistance, including board payments, from the 8 department, except for financial assistance for which the relative, fictive 9 kin, or other person has applied and for which the relative, fictive kin, or 10 other person qualifies under the program guidelines, such as the Transitional Employment Assistance Program, § 20-76-401, food stamps, Medicaid, and the 11 12 federal adoption subsidy; and 13 (C) The department shall not be ordered to pay the 14 equivalent of board payments, adoption subsidies, or guardianship subsidies 15 to the relative, fictive kin, or other person as reasonable efforts to prevent removal of custody from the relative, fictive kin, or other person. 16 17 (c)(1) Juveniles who are in the custody of the department shall be 18 allowed trial placements with parents or the person from whom custody was 19 removed for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days The court may order 20 juveniles who are in the custody of the department to be placed in a trial 21 placement with parents or the person from whom custody was removed for a 22 period not to exceed sixty (60) days, except as approved by the department, 23 and in any event, not to exceed six (6) months. 24 (2)(A) At every stage of the case, the court shall consider the 25 least restrictive placement for the juvenile and assess safety concerns that prevent either a trial home placement or the juvenile from being returned to 26 27 or placed in the custody of the parent of the juvenile. 28 (B) The court shall detail the safety concerns in 29 subdivision (c)(2)(A) of this section in its written order. 30 (C) Failure to complete a case plan is not a sufficient reason in and of itself to deny the placement of the juvenile in the home of 31 32 a parent. (D) Trial home placements may be made with parents or the 33 34 person from whom custody was removed.

(2)(3) At the end of sixty (60) days trial placement, the court

whom custody was removed, or the department shall return the juvenile to a licensed or approved foster home, shelter, or facility or an exempt child welfare agency as defined in § 9-28-402(12).

(d) When a juvenile leaves the custody of the department and the court grants custody to the parent or another person, the department is no longer legal custodian of the juvenile, even if the juvenile division of circuit court retains jurisdiction.
