22	WHEREAS, the Junior League of Little Rock, Arkansas, is entering its
23	95th year of service to the city's community; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, the Junior League of Little Rock is an organization of women
26	committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women, and
27	improving the community through the effective action and leadership of
28	trained volunteers; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, its purpose is exclusively educational and charitable, and its
31	membership consists of over 1,000 dynamic women representing a diverse group
32	of races, religions, and professional fields; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, the Junior League's rich history includes participating in the
35	formation of several community institutions, including the Arkansas Arts
36	Center, Riverfest, the Museum of Discovery, Potluck Food Rescue, Gaines



1	House, the Parent Center at the Centers for Youth and Families, Volunteers in
2	Public Schools, and more; and

4	WHEREAS, the Junior League of Little Rock is currently focusing its
5	community projects and advocacy efforts on creating meaningful change to
6	improve the school preparedness and health and wellness of Arkansas children,
7	including joining the Arkansas Campaign for Grade-Level Reading to hold
8	literacy events for children in Arkansas Head Start programs, supporting
9	access to quality preschool education, and promoting better nutrition and
10	consistent physical activity; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, the Junior League of Little Rock has also continued this
13	legacy of voluntarism and civic leadership by launching a Nonprofit Board
14	Institute, a training course to bolster effective board engagement in the
15	nonprofit sector as well as transforming the 3rd floor of its historic
16	headquarters into the Junior League of Little Rock Nonprofit Center, a shared
17	work space for social entrepreneurs, foundations, and nonprofit organizations
18	whose work is making a difference in Arkansas communities, and which also
19	provides a Resource Center and training program to foster organizational
20	growth and capacity while enhancing the missions of resident nonprofit
21	organizations,

23	NOW THEREFORE,
24	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
25	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
26	
27	THAT the Senate recognizes the Junior League of Little Rock for its
28	ninety-five-year history of training community and civic leaders, and its
29	continued service to the community of Little Rock.

31	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, a copy shall be
32	provided to President Amanda M. Richardson by the Secretary of the Senate.
