8 RECOGNIZING THE CHICKAMAUGA CHEROKEE PEOPLE AS
9 INDIGENOUS PEOPLE TO THE STATE OF ARKANSAS.

13 RECOGNIZING THE CHICKAMAUGA CHEROKEE
14 PEOPLE AS INDIGENOUS PEOPLE TO THE STATE
15 OF ARKANSAS.

18 WHEREAS, the Chickamauga Cherokee were a group that separated from the
19 greater body of the Cherokee tribes during the American Revolution and
20 relocated to a more isolated area to gain distance from colonists'
21 encroachments; and

22
23 WHEREAS, frontier Americans associated this band with their new town on
24 the Chickamauga Creek, and began to refer to them as the Chickamaugas, and 5
25 years later, once more they moved further west and southwest into what is now
26 Alabama, establishing 5 larger settlements; and they were then more commonly
27 known as the "Lower Town Cherokee"; and

28
29 WHEREAS, the Chickamauga Cherokee people entered into the Treaty of
30 Hopewell on November 28, 1785, with the United States of America, which
31 states, "The said Indians for themselves and their respective tribes and
32 towns do acknowledge all the Cherokee to be under the protection of the
33 United States of America"; and

34
35 WHEREAS, under increased United States Government pressure to cede its
36 lands and remove to the west of the Mississippi River, and believing removal



1 was inevitable and trying to get the best lands possible, the Chickamauga
2 Cherokee people agreed with President Thomas Jefferson in the spring of 1808
3 to be removed to Dardanelle on the Arkansas River; and

4

5 WHEREAS, the Chickamauga Cherokee people lived in hiding for most of
6 the past 200 years for fear of being exterminated, separated from their
7 families and removed to a reservation or losing their land; and

8

9 WHEREAS, the Chickamauga Cherokee people could not vote until 1924, and
10 could not freely teach their children their religions or customs until
11 passage of the 1978 American Indian Religious Freedom Act; and

12

13 WHEREAS, the Chickamauga Cherokee people have served admirably in the
14 Armed Forces of the United States and served in elected and appointed
15 positions in local and state government; and

16

17 WHEREAS, the Chickamauga Cherokee people want to protect and share
18 their customs and heritage for current and future generations,

19

20 NOW THEREFORE,

21 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
22 STATE OF ARKANSAS:

23

24 THAT the Senate recognizes the Chickamauga Cherokee people as an
25 indigenous people to our state and that under the Treaty of Hopewell and laws
26 of the State of Arkansas, the Chickamauga Cherokee people have the same
27 rights and protections that are afforded to all of the state's citizens.

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, a copy shall be
30 provided to the leader of the Chickamauga Cherokee people by the Secretary of
31 the Senate.
