Creation. 15 The Division of Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprise of the 16 Arkansas Economic Development Commission: 17 (1) Is established and confirmed within the Arkansas Economic 18 Development Commission under the jurisdiction of the Arkansas Economic 19 Development Council; 20 Shall be operated as a division within the commission; and 21 Shall perform the functions and duties as provided in this 22 subchapter. 23 15-4-305. - 1 (2) With the participation of other state departments and state 2 agencies as appropriate:
- 3 (A) Develop comprehensive plans and specific program goals
  4 for a minority business enterprise and women-owned business enterprise
  5 program;
- 6 (B) Establish regular performance monitoring and reporting 7 systems to assure that goals are being achieved; and
- 8 (C) Evaluate the impact of federal and state support in 9 achieving the objectives established by the Arkansas Economic Development 10 Commission;
- 11 (3) Implement state policy in support of minority business
  12 enterprise and development <u>and women-owned business enterprise and</u>
  13 <u>development</u> and coordinate the plans, programs, and operations of state
  14 government that affect or may contribute to the establishment, preservation,
  15 and strengthening of minority business enterprises <u>and women-owned business</u>

- 17 (4) Coordinate, make application for, and administer federal 18 funding grants from the Minority Business Development Agency of the United 19 States Department of Commerce, the United States Small Business 20 Administration, and other federal agencies where applicable;
  - (5) Promote the mobilization of activities and resources of state agencies and local governments, business and trade associations, universities, foundations, professional organizations, and volunteer and other groups toward the growth of minority business enterprises and womenowned business enterprises, and facilitate the coordination of the efforts of these groups with those of other state departments and state agencies;
  - (6) Establish a center for the development, collection, and dissemination of information that will be helpful to persons and organizations throughout the state in undertaking or promoting the establishment and successful operation of minority business enterprises and women-owned business enterprises;
  - (7) Conduct coordinated reviews of all proposed state training and technical assistance activities in direct support of the minority business enterprise and women-owned business enterprise program to ensure consistency with program goals and to preclude duplication of effort of other state agencies with overlapping jurisdictions;

- 4 (9) Assist minority business enterprises <u>and women-owned</u>

- (b)(1) The council shall consist of seven (7) members.

15-4-312. State agencies to submit reports.

The Minority <u>and Women-owned</u> Business Advisory Council shall require each state agency to produce within fifteen (15) days of the close of each three-month period a report summing up total procurement for all state contracts, except exempt state contracts of the state agency, and the dollar value and the percentage of the contracts of the state agency awarded to minority business enterprises <u>and women-owned business enterprises</u>.

15-4-313. Accelerated payments.

To ensure that minority business enterprises <u>and women-owned business</u> <u>enterprises</u> are not financially hindered due to delays in payment by state agencies entering into state contracts with minority business enterprises <u>and women-owned business enterprises</u> under this subchapter, state agencies shall accelerate payment to minority vendors <u>and women-owned vendors</u> to preclude accounts receivable problems of minority business enterprises <u>and women-owned business enterprises</u> caused by the State of Arkansas.

- 15-4-314. Minority business enterprises <u>and women-owned business</u> enterprises certification process.
