21	(a) If a perso	n knows that his or her immediate arr	est or detention is
22	being attempted by a duly authorized law enforcement officer, it is the		
23	lawful duty of the person to refrain from fleeing, either on foot or by means		
24	of any vehicle or con	veyance.	
25	(b) Fleeing is	a separate offense and is not consid	ered a lesser
26	included offense or c	omponent offense with relation to oth	er offenses which
27	may occur simultaneou	sly with the fleeing.	
28	(c) Fleeing on	foot is considered a Class C misdeme	anor, except under
29	the following conditi	ons:	
30	(1) If t	he defendant has been previously conv	icted of fleeing on
31	foot anytime within t	he past one-year period, a subsequent	fleeing on foot
32	offense is a Class B	misdemeanor;	
33	(2) If p	roperty damage occurs as a direct res	ult of the fleeing

2	(d)(l)(A) Fleeing by means of any vehicle or conveyance is considered			
3	a Class A misdemeanor.			
4	(B) A person convicted under subdivision (d)(1)(A) of this			
5	section shall serve a minimum of two (2) days in jail.			
6	(2) Fleeing by means of any vehicle or conveyance is considered			
7	a Class D felony if, under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to			
8	the value of human life, a person purposely operates the vehicle or			
9	conveyance in such a manner that creates a substantial danger of death or			
10	serious physical injury to another person.			
11	(3) If serious physical injury to any person occurs as a direct			
12	result of fleeing by means of any vehicle or conveyance, the fleeing by means			
13	of any vehicle or conveyance offense is a Class C felony.			
14	(e) Regardless of the circumstances in subdivisions (e)(1)-(3) of thi			
15	section, if the defendant is under twenty-one (21) years of age and has not			
16	been previously convicted of fleeing, the offense of fleeing is a Class C			
17	misdemeanor.			
18	(f)(e) In addition to any other penalty, if the defendant is convicted			
19	of violating subsection (d) of this section, the court shall instruct the			
20	Office of Driver Services of the Department of Finance and Administration to			
21	suspend or revoke the defendant's driver's license for at least six (6)			
22	months but not more than one (1) year.
