27	SECTION 1. DO NOT CO	DIFY. <u>Legislative findin</u>	gs and purpose.
28	(a) The General Asse	embly finds that:	
29	(1) Transparen	cy and participation by t	<u>he public in the</u>

1 amendment is a reasonable amount of time to comply with the Arkansas 2 Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq.; (5) The fiscal year for the State of Arkansas begins on July 1 3 4 of each year and ends on June 30 of each year; 5 (6) It is an unwise expenditure of public resources to enact the 6 necessary appropriations and acts and establish the necessary fiscal and 7 regulatory provisions for the sale and use of medical marijuana when 8 marijuana is illegal in the United States of America and within the State of 9 Arkansas; and 10 (7) The effective date of the legalization of marijuana under federal law is a better appropriate date for the Medical Marijuana Commission 11 12 to begin accepting applications and for the implementation of the Arkansas 13 Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016. 14 (b) The purpose of this act is to clarify that the effective date of 15 the legalization of medical marijuana within the State of Arkansas shall be the date on which the provisions of the "Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment 16 17 of 2016" or any provisions of the enabling legislation are not in violation 18 of the United States statutory law. 19 20 SECTION 2. Pursuant to § 23 of Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, 21 also known as the "Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016", Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, § 4(b), concerning the rules of the Department of 22 23 Health regarding the registry identification cards, as amended by Acts 2017, 24 No. 4, is amended to read as follows: 25 (b) Not later than one hundred eighty (180) days after the effective 26 date of this amendment the legalization of medical marijuana in the United 27 States and the State of Arkansas, the department shall adopt rules governing: 28 (1) The manner in which the department considers applications 29 for and renewals for registry identification cards; 30 (2) Labeling and testing standards for marijuana distributed to 31 qualifying patients; and 32 (3) Any other matters necessary for the department's fair, 33 impartial, stringent, and comprehensive administration of this amendment.

Pursuant to § 23 of Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, also known as the "Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016", Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, § 8(d) and (e), concerning the rules of the Medical Marijuana Commission and the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division of the Department of Finance and Administration regarding dispensaries and cultivation facilities, as amended by Acts 2017, No. 4, is amended to read as follows:
- 17 (d) Not later than one hundred eighty (180) days after the effective
 18 date of this amendment the legalization of medical marijuana in the United
 19 States and the State of Arkansas, the commission shall adopt rules governing:
 - (1) The manner in which the commission considers applications for and renewals of licenses for dispensaries and cultivation facilities;

SECTION 7. Pursuant to § 23 of Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, also known as the "Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016", Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, § 9(c), concerning the rules of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division of the Department of Finance and Administration regarding dispensary agents and cultivation facility agents, as amended by Acts 2017, No. 4, is amended to read as follows:

- 9 (c) Not later than one hundred eighty (180) days after the effective 10 date of this amendment the legalization of medical marijuana in the United 11 States and the State of Arkansas, the division shall adopt rules governing:
- 12 (1) The manner in which the division considers applications for 13 and renewals of registry identification cards for dispensary agents and 14 cultivation facility agents;
- 15 (2) The form and content of registration and renewal applications for dispensary agents and cultivation facility agents;
- 17 (3) Procedures for suspending or terminating the registration of 18 dispensary agents and cultivation facility agents who violate the provisions 19 of this amendment or the rules adopted under this amendment, procedures for 20 appealing penalties, and a schedule of penalties; and
 - (4) Any other matters necessary for the division's fair, impartial, stringent, and comprehensive administration of its duties under this amendment.

SECTION 8. Pursuant to § 23 of Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, also known as the "Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016", Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, is amended to add new section to read as follows: § 24. Effective date.

The effective date of the legalization of medical marijuana within the State of Arkansas shall be the date on which the provisions of the "Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016" or any provisions of the enabling legislation are not in violation of the United States statutory law.

SECTION 9. <u>RETROACTIVITY</u>. This act is retroactive to the effective

date of Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 98, which is also known as the

"Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016".

2	SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the						
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the dates set for rulemaking						
4	within the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 are impractical to						
5	encompass the magnitude of the medical marijuana program; that the Department						
6	of Health, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division of the Department of						
7	Finance and Administration, and the Medical Marijuana Commission need						
8	additional time to properly establish a medical marijuana program to fulfill						
9	the policies and purposes of the Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of						
10	2016; that the federal preemption doctrine holds that federal law preempts						
11	state law when there is a conflict of laws; that the marijuana is illegal						
12	under federal law, in particular under the Controlled Substances Act, 21						
13	U.S.C. § 801 et seq.; and that this act is immediately necessary to stop						
14	agencies from performing wasteful and unnecessary work when the Arkansas						
15	Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 may be in violation of federal law.						
16	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately						
17	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall						
18	become effective on:						
19	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;						
20	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,						
21	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the						
22	bill; or						
23	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is						
24	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
