26	(a) The Genera	al Assembly finds that:

6	exemption for military pay to foreign service officers and specialists to		
7	encourage them to choose or retain Arkansas as:		
8	(A) Their state of residency while employed by the United		
9	States Department of State; and		
10	(B) The place they intend to retire.

12	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 26-51-306 is amended to read as follows:		
13	26-51-306. Compensation and benefits from military service $-$		
14	Definition.		
15	(a)(1)(A) For tax years beginning before January 1, 2007, no member of		
16	the armed services of the United States shall be liable for or required to		
17	pay any income tax on the first six thousand dollars (\$6,000) of service pay		
18	or allowances.		
19	(B)(i) For tax years 2005 and 2006, enlisted personnel of		
20	the armed services of the State of Arkansas or of the United States shall not		
21	be liable for or required to pay any income tax on the first nine thousand		
22	dollars (\$9,000) of service pay or allowances.		
23	(ii) For tax years 2005 and 2006, an officer or a		
24	warrant officer of the armed services of the State of Arkansas or of the		
25	United States is only entitled to the exemption in subdivision (a)(1)(A) of		
26	this section and is not entitled to the exemption in subdivision (a)(1)(B)(i)		
27	of this section.		
28	(C) For tax years beginning on and after January 1, 2007,		
29	any member of the armed services of the State of Arkansas or the United		
30	States is not liable for or required to pay any income tax on the first nine		
31	thousand dollars (\$9,000) of service pay or allowance.		
32	(D)(i) For tax years beginning on or after January 1,		
33	2014 , the $\underline{\text{The}}$ service pay or allowance received by an active duty member of		
34	the armed services or foreign service personnel is exempt from the income tax		
35	imposed under this chapter.

3	(2) The compensation and benefits are declared exempt, to the
4	extent of the amounts provided in subdivision (a)(1) of this section, from
5	the state income tax.
6	(3) All service pay or allowances of members of the armed
7	services of the State of Arkansas or the United States in excess of the
8	amounts provided in subdivision (a)(1) of this section shall be subject to
9	the state income tax, unless otherwise provided for in this section.
10	$\frac{(4)(A)}{(2)(A)}$ Title 26 U.S.C. §§ 112 and 692, as in effect on
11	January 1, 2007, regarding combat zone compensation of members of the armed
12	forces and income taxes of members of the armed forces on death are adopted.
13	(B) The provisions contained in 26 U.S.C. § 112 are in
14	addition to all other provisions contained in this section.
15	(b) Nothing in this This section shall does not exempt from taxation
16	the income of members of the armed services or foreign service personnel
17	derived from $\frac{\text{other}}{\text{other}}$ sources $\frac{\text{other}}{\text{other}}$ than their service pay and allowances.
18	(c) As used in this section;:
19	(1) "Active duty member of the armed services" means all members
20	of the armed forces, including the National Guard and reserve units;
21	(2) "armed Armed services" means any and all members of the
22	National Guard, reserve components of the armed forces, United States Army,
23	Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Air Force, and any and all other branches of
24	the military and naval forces or auxiliaries; and
25	(3) "Foreign service personnel" means a person who:
26	(A) Is employed by the United States Department of State
27	in the position of a foreign service officer or foreign service specialist;
28	<u>and</u>
29	(B) Resides outside of the state more than one hundred
30	eighty (180) days in the calendar year.
31	
32	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective for tax years
33	beginning on and after January 1, 2019.
