3	24-8-710. Eligibility for benefits — Retirement generally.		
4	(a) Any member who has a minimum of twenty (20) years of actual		
5	service may retire regardless of age, and any judge or justice who has served		
6	at least eight (8) years shall be eligible for benefits upon reaching age		
7	sixty-five (65).		
8	(b)(1) Any judge or justice who becomes seventy (70) years of age		
9	during a term of office to which he or she has been elected may complete the		
10	term without forfeiting his or her rights to retirement benefits under this		
11	section.		
12	(2)(A) Any judge or justice who is not eligible to retire at ago		
13	seventy (70) may continue to serve as judge or justice until the completion		
14	of the term of office in which he or she has sufficient service to retire		
15	without losing his or her retirement benefits.		
16	(B) The judge or justice shall lose all retirement		
17	benefits if he or she serves beyond the end of the term needed to get		
18	sufficient service to retire.		
19	(3)(A) Otherwise, judges or justices must retire by their		
20	seventieth birthday or lose their retirement benefits.		
21	(B) However, any active judge or justice who was serving
