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19	4-118-103. Unconscionable terms in standard-form contracts —		
20	Prohibited.		
21	(a) In a standard-form contract to which one (1) of the parties to the		
22	standard-form contract is an individual and that individual did not draft the		
23	standard-form contract, there is a rebuttable presumption that the following		
24	contractual terms are substantively unconscionable when included in a		
25	standard-form contract:		
26	(1) A requirement that resolution of legal claims take place in		
27	an inconvenient venue;		
28	(2) A waiver of the individual's right to assert claims or seek		
29	remedies provided by state or federal statute;		
30	(3) A waiver of the individual's right to seek punitive damages		
31	as provided by law;		
32	(4) A provision that limits the time in which an action may be		
33	brought under the standard-form contract or that waives the statute of		
34	limitations under § 4-2-725, § 16-56-105, § 16-56-111, and § 16-56-115; and		
35	(5) A requirement that the individual pay fees and costs to		
36	bring a legal claim subsequently in excess of the required fees and costs to		

1	bring a claim in a state court or in a federal court.		
2	(b)(1) When determining whether the terms described in subsection (a)		
3	of this section are unenforceable, a court shall consider the principles that		
4	normally guide courts in this state in determining whether unconscionable		
5	terms are enforceable.		
6	(2) The common law and the Uniform Commercial Code shall guide		
7	courts in determining the enforceability of unfair terms not specifically		
8	identified under subsection (a) of this section.		
9	(c) If a party claims or it appears to the court that the standard-		
10	form contract or any clause within the standard-form contract is		
11	unconscionable, the parties shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity to		
12	present evidence regarding its commercial setting, purpose, and effect to aid		
13	the court in making a determination.		
14	(d) If a court finds the a standard-form contract contains an		
15	unconscionable term, the court shall:		
16	(1) Limit the application of the unconscionable term or the		
17	clause containing that term as to avoid any illegal or unconscionable result;
