1	(1) "Participating court" means a court that uses the uniform		
2	case management software promulgated by the Administrative Office of the		
3	Courts; and		
4	(2) "Person" means a person who is or has been incarcerated or		
5	detained in a county jail, local detention facility, or regional detention		
6	facility.		
7	(b) The office shall establish a uniform data collection system to		
8	collect data regarding each setting and modification of bail from every		
9	participating court.		
10	(c) A court that uses the office's case management software system		
11	shall collect and remit to the office the following data regarding every		
12	person:		
13	(1) Any arrest date, any bail hearing date, any date the person		
14	is admitted to bail, and any date of bail modification;		
15	(2) The person authorized to take bail, as defined under § 16-		
16	84-102, who has set or modified bail;		
17	(3) Information about the person, including the person's year of		
18	birth, race, ethnicity, gender, primary language, and residential zip code;		
19	(4) Information concerning whether the person is considered		
20	indigent by the court;		
21	(5) Information related to the person's charges or reason for		
22	detention, including:		
23	(A) The number of charges; and		
24	(B) The most serious offense for which the person is		
25	charged and a general description and classification of the offense;		
26	(6) Information concerning whether the person is admitted to		
27	bail or whether the bail has been modified;		
28	(7) Information related to the conditions of bail and the bond		
29	for the person, including without limitation:		
30	(A) Whether the bond was secured or unsecured;		
31	(B) The monetary amount set on the bond, including the		
32	amount set on both secured and unsecured bonds;		
33	(C) Initial nonmonetary conditions of release imposed;		
34	(D) Subsequent modifications of the bail;		
35	(E) The total amount of money paid on the bond; and

7	United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement or other detention hold		
8	from another jurisdiction;		
9	(10) Any date where a person failed to appear for a court
