35	13-15-101. Title	<u>e.</u>	
36	This chapter sha	ll be known and may be cited as t	the "Arkansas Delta

1	Music Trail Act".
2	
3	13-15-102. Definitions.
4	As used in this chapter:
5	(1) "Art project" means a work of visual art, including without
6	limitation a sculpture, mural, photographic rendering, mosaic, and electronic
7	art installation, that is:
8	(A) Permanently installed in a space;
9	(B) Visible from public roadways and walkways without the
10	payment of a required fee; and
11	(C) Installed within two (2) miles of a designated music
12	highway;
13	(2) "Designated music highway" means each of the following:
14	(A) Rock 'n' Roll Highway 67, as designated in § 27-67-
15	<u>223;</u>
16	(B) Louis Jordan Memorial Highway, as designated in § 27-
17	<u>67-227;</u>
18	(C) Levon Helm Memorial Highway, as designated in § 27-67-
19	<u>227;</u>
20	(D) Sister Rosetta Tharpe Memorial Highway, as designated
21	<u>in § 27-67-227;</u>
22	(E) Americana Music Highway, as designated in § 27-67-227;
23	(F) Johnny Cash Memorial Highway, as designated in § 27-
24	67-227; and
25	(G) Delta Rhythm & Bayous Highway, as designated in § 27-
26	<u>67-226</u> ;
27	(3) "Person" means an individual, trust, estate, fiduciary,
28	partnership, limited liability company, limited liability partnership,
29	corporation, or any other legal entity; and
30	(4)(A) "Qualified expenses" means the costs and expenses
31	incurred by a person to create and install an art project.
32	(B) "Qualified expenses" includes without limitation the
33	cost of supplies necessary to create and install an art project and the cost
34	of an artist's labor in creating the art project.
35	(C) "Qualified expenses" does not include costs or
36	expenses related to building a structure that is not used exclusively to

1	support or display an art project.
2	
3	<u>Subchapter 2 — Arkansas Delta Music Commission</u>
4	
5	13-15-201. Creation — Membership.
6	(a) There is created the Arkansas Delta Music Commission within the
7	Department of Arkansas Heritage.
8	(b) The commission shall be composed of nine (9) members:
9	(1) The Director of the Department of Arkansas Heritage or his
10	or her designee;
11	(2) The Director of the Department of Parks and Tourism or his
12	or her designee; and
13	(3)(A)(i) One (1) individual who shall be appointed from each
14	region containing a designated music highway.
15	(ii) The region for each designated music highway
16	shall be composed of the counties through which the designated music highway
17	runs.
18	(B) The Governor shall appoint the members of the
19	commission under this subdivision (b)(3).
20	(C)(i) Four (4) of the members appointed under this
21	subdivision (b)(3) shall have a background in the arts.
22	(ii) The remaining three (3) members shall have a
23	background in the arts, history, or tourism.
24	(c)(1) The term of office of the initial members of the commission
25	appointed under subdivision (b)(3) of this section shall be determined by lot
26	as follows:
27	(A) The initial term of office of three (3) of the members
28	shall be two (2) years; and
29	(B) The initial term of office of four (4) of the members
30	shall be three (3) years.
31	(2) All successor members, other than those appointed to fill
32	unexpired terms, shall serve two-year terms.
33	(c) All vacancies in positions filled by members appointed under
34	subdivision (b)(3) of this section shall be filled by appointment by the
35	Governor and shall be for the remainder of the term.
36	(d) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation for

1	their service but may receive expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-
2	<u>16-901 et seq.</u>
3	(e) The Department of Arkansas Heritage shall provide meeting space
4	and staffing for the commission.
5	
6	13-15-202. Meetings.
7	(a)(1) The Arkansas Delta Music Commission shall meet as often as
8	necessary to perform its duties under this chapter.
9	(2) The commission shall meet at least quarterly.
10	(b) The Director of the Department of Arkansas Heritage shall call the
11	first meeting of the commission.
12	(c)(1) At the first meeting of the commission, the commission shall
13	select a Chair of the Arkansas Delta Music Commission.
14	(2) The chair shall serve as chair for the period of time
15	determined by the commission.
16	(d) A quorum for each meeting of the commission shall be five (5)
17	members.
18	(e) A majority vote of the members present is required for the
19	commission to take action.
20	
21	13-15-203. Powers and duties.
22	(a) The Arkansas Delta Music Commission shall:
23	(1) Develop, implement, and administer a tourism program based
24	on art projects that focus on highlighting music stories and related dynamics
25	on the designated music highways;
26	(2) Develop guidelines for the types of art projects that will
27	be eligible for the tax incentives provided in this chapter and the process
28	for applying for approval of qualified expenses for art projects under this
29	chapter;
30	(3) Create a signage program that captures the stories,
31	biographies, and points of interest in blues, rock and roll, jazz,
32	rockabilly, soul, hip hop, opera, country, and gospel music throughout the
33	Arkansas Delta;
34	(4) Maintain information about federal and state grant
35	opportunities to encourage cities and towns to develop exhibits related to
36	the musical heritage of the city or town; and

1	(5) Adopt rules necessary to implement the Arkansas Delta Music
2	Trail Program created under this chapter, including without limitation rules
3	stating:
4	(A) The procedure to apply for approval of qualified
5	expenses; and
6	(B) The criteria to be used by the commission when
7	determining whether to approve qualified expenses and issue a certificate of
8	completion for an art project.
9	(b) The commission may accept, receive, and use grants, moneys,
10	equipment, material, services, and real and personal property donated,
11	bequeathed, or devised for any purpose relating to the activities of the
12	commission and not expressly designated for any other agency.
13	
14	13-15-204. Biennial report.
15	(a) The Arkansas Delta Music Commission shall submit a report by
16	December 31 of each even-numbered year to the:
17	(1) Governor;
18	(2) Chair of the Senate Committee on Revenue and Taxation;
19	(3) Chair of the House Committee on Revenue and Taxation;
20	(4) Chair of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, and
21	Economic Development; and
22	(5) Chair of the House Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, and
23	Economic Development.
24	(b) The report required under subsection (a) of this section shall
25	include:
26	(1) The commission's goals for increasing the number of art
27	projects and signage over the next biennium;
28	(2) The economic development opportunities the commission will
29	focus on over the next biennium;
30	(3) The qualified expenses approved under this chapter during
31	the biennium for which the report is being made, including without
32	limitation:
33	(A) The name of the person who applied for approval of
34	qualified expenses for an art project;
35	(B) A description of the art project for which the
36	qualified expenses were approved: and

1	(C) The location of the art project for which the
2	qualified expenses were approved; and
3	(4) The benefits realized in terms of economic development as a
4	result of the commission's actions and the tax incentives provided under this
5	chapter.
6	
7	<u>Subchapter 3 — Arkansas Delta Music Trail Program</u>
8	
9	13-15-301. Creation.
10	(a) The Arkansas Delta Music Commission shall establish and administer
11	the Arkansas Delta Music Trail Program to:
12	(1) Create a tourism program based on art projects that focus on
13	highlighting music stories and related dynamics on the designated music
14	highways;
15	(2) Provide tax incentives to eligible persons for the creation
16	and installation of an art project under this chapter; and
17	(3) Create a signage program that captures the stories,
18	biographies, and points of interest in blues, rock and roll, jazz,
19	rockabilly, soul, hip hop, opera, country, and gospel music throughout the
20	Delta region of Arkansas.
21	(b) The Department of Arkansas Heritage and the Department of Parks
22	and Tourism shall provide assistance to the commission in establishing and
23	administering the program.
24	
25	13-15-302. Income tax credit for approved art project.
26	(a) There is allowed an income tax credit against the income tax
27	imposed by the Income Tax Act of 1929, § 26-51-101 et seq., in an amount
28	equal to the lesser of one hundred percent (100%) of the total qualified
29	expenses stated in a certificate of completion issued by the Arkansas Delta
30	Music Commission under § 13-15-303 or twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000).
31	(b) The amount of the income tax credit under this section that may be
32	claimed by the taxpayer in a tax year shall not exceed the amount of income
33	tax due by the taxpayer.
34	(c) Any unused income tax credit under this section may be carried
35	forward for five (5) consecutive tax years following the tax year in which
36	the income tax credit was earned.

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2	13-15-303. Application for approval of qualified expenses -
3	Certificate of completion.
4	(a) A person may apply to the Arkansas Delta Music Commission for
5	approval of qualified expenses for the purpose of claiming the income tax
6	credit allowed under § 13-15-302.
7	(b) An application for approval of qualified expenses shall:
8	(1) Be for an art project that will:
9	(A) Stimulate regional tourism;
10	(B) Enhance local community development efforts;
11	(C) Create opportunities for Arkansas artists to showcase
12	their work;
13	(D) Enhance the community where the art project will be
14	located; and
15	(E) Promote awareness and encourage the enjoyment of the
16	stories, biographies, and points of interest in blues, rock and roll,
17	country, and gospel music throughout the Arkansas Delta;
18	(2) Be in the form prescribed by the commission; and
19	(3) Indicate the amount of qualified expenses the applicant
20	expects to incur.
21	(c)(1) The commission shall not approve qualified expenses exceeding
22	two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in any one (1) calendar year.
23	(2)(A) The total amount of qualified expenses that may be
24	approved under this subsection shall be divided among the designated music
25	highways in proportion to each designated music highway's length as compared
26	to the total length of all of the designated music highways.
27	(B) If the commission does not approve qualified expenses
28	under this section that are equal to the amount of funds allocated to a
29	designated music highway under subdivision (c)(2) of this section, the
30	commission may reallocate the funds to another designated music highway to
31	fund one (1) or more additional art projects.
32	(3)(A) The approval of qualified expenses under this section is
33	contingent on the appropriation and availability of funding for the Arkansas
34	Delta Music Trail Program.
35	(B) The commission shall not solicit or accept
36	applications for the program if funds for the program are not available.

I	(d) At least one-third (1/3) of art projects for which qualified
2	expenses are approved under this section shall be visible from a designated
3	music highway.
4	(e)(1) Upon completion of an art project, the owner shall submit
5	documentation required by the commission to verify that the completed art
6	project complies with the requirements of this chapter.
7	(2) If the commission determines that an art project is complete
8	and complies with the requirements of this chapter, the commission shall
9	issue a certification of completion specifying the total amount of qualified
10	expenses and the income tax credit allowed under this subchapter.
11	
12	13-15-304. Highway signage.
13	(a) The Arkansas Department of Transportation shall erect appropriate
14	signs along each of the designated music highways, including without
15	limitation a sign at or near each of the art projects that has been issued a
16	certificate of completion under § 13-15-303.
17	(b) If the department does not have the funds available to erect the
18	signs required under subsection (a) of this section, the department may
19	accept and use gifts, grants, and donations received from private, public,
20	and nonprofit sources, including without limitation a city street department
21	or a county road department for:
22	(1) Acquiring and installing the signs required under subsection
23	(a) of this section; and
24	(2) Maintaining, replacing, or reconstructing the signs required
25	under subsection (a) of this section.
26	
27	SECTION 2. DO NOT CODIFY. Rules.
28	(a) When adopting the initial rules required under this act, the
29	Arkansas Delta Music Commission shall file the final rules with the Secretary
30	of State for adoption under § 25-15-204(f):
31	(1) On or before July 1, 2020; or
32	(2) If approval under § 10-3-309 has not occurred by July 1,
33	2020, as soon as practicable after approval under § 10-3-309.
34	(b) The commission shall file the proposed rules with the Legislative
35	Council under § 10-3-309(c) sufficiently in advance of July 1, 2020, so that
36	the Legislative Council may consider the rules for approval before July 1,

1	2020.
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
