1 for a period that exceeds the time prescribed by the United States 2 Immigration and Customs Enforcement, an agency of the Department of Homeland 3 Security, can be used to circumvent federal law and cause confusion on the 4 status of the individual to whom it is issued. 5 The purpose of \$\$ 27-16-1111 and \$ 27-16-1112 is to ensure that 6 driver's licenses and identification cards issued by the state are not used 7 to circumvent federal immigration laws or federal authority on immigration 8 matters by preventing an applicant for the issuance or renewal of a driver's 9 license or an identification card from obtaining an identity document issued 10 by the state that is valid for a period that exceeds the applicant's 11 authorization to be lawfully present in the United States. 12 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 27-16-1111, is amended to read as follows: 13 14 27-16-1111. Expiration Issuance of driver's license when the applicant 15 is not a United States citizen. 16 (a)(1) If an applicant for a driver's license under this chapter is 17 not a citizen of the United States as provided under § 27-16-18 1105(a)(1)(D)(ii)-(xi), the expiration date of the driver's license shall be 19 the shortest of: 20 (1) The period provided for under § 27-16-901(a)(1)(A); or 21 (2) The last date the applicant may be present in the United 22 States under federal immigration laws, as verified by the Bureau of 23 Citizenship and Immigration Services of the Department of Homeland Security 24 according to: 25 (A)(i) The status completion date on a United States 26 Customs and Border Protection Form I 94, Arrival/Departure Record or 27 admission stamp. 28 (ii) If the applicant is the holder of a nonimmigrant visa as described in § 27-16-1105(a)(1)(D)(iv), an additional 29 30 two hundred forty (240) days shall be allowed following the status completion date in subdivision (a)(2)(A)(i) of this section if the applicant presents a 31 32 valid Form I-797C, Notice of Action; or 33 (B) If the applicant is a spouse or minor child as 34 described under 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(15)(F)(ii) as in effect on January 1, 2013, of a bona fide student under 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(15)(F)(i) as in effect 35

on January 1, 2013, who has been given authorization for optional practical

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1	training under 8 C.F.R. $\S$ 214.2(f)(10)(ii) as in effect on January 1, 2013,		
2	the end date on the employment authorization document issued by the Bureau of		
3	Citizenship and Immigration Services of the Department of Homeland Security

5	(b) The Office of Driver Services may renew the driver's license only		
6	if it is demonstrated that the applicant's continued presence in the United		
7	States is authorized under federal law.		
8	If an applicant for a driver's license under this chapter is unable to		
9	provide satisfactory evidence of legal residency status as provided under §		
10	27-16-1105(a)(1)(D), the Office of Motor Vehicle shall issue a driver's		
11	license to an applicant who:		
12	(A) Provides proof of his or her identity;		
13	(B) Meets all other minimum driver's license issuance		
14	requirements under § 27-16-1105(a);		
15	(C) Provides documentation of a Social Security number		
16	issued by the Social Security Administration or an individual taxpayer		
17	identification number issued by the Internal Revenue Service;		
18	(D) Provides proof of residence in the state as required		
19	for the issuance of a driver's license under § 27-16-1101 et seq.; and		
20	(E) Affirms in an affidavit signed by the applicant that		
21	he or she has:		
22	(i) Applied to be lawfully present within the		
23	United States or will apply to be lawfully present as soon as the applicant		
24	is eligible; and		
25	(ii) Been a resident of the state for at least		
26	twelve (12) months and provides evidence of residence in the state.		
27	(2) Proof of identity under subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this		
28	section may be established with one (1) or more of the following:		
29	(A) A valid foreign passport, with or without a United		
30	States Customs and Border Protection entry form or stamp;		
31	(B) A valid consular identification document issued by the		
32	government of Mexico or Guatemala or by another foreign government with		
33	comparable security standards and protocols as determined by the Director of		
34	the Department of Finance and Administration;		
35	(C) A Social Security card;		
36	(D) A certified record of the applicant's birth, marriage,		

1	adoption, or divorce, including a translation of the certified record if		
2	necessary; or		
3	(E) Other documentation authorized by the Department of		
4	Finance and Administration.		
5	(3) Proof of residence in the state may be established in the		
6	same manner required for the issuance of a driver's license to an applicant		
7	under § 27-16-1101 et seq.		
8	(b) A driver's license issued under subsection (a) of this section:		
9	(1) Is not valid for federal identification purposes; and		
10	(2) Expires as authorized by § 27-16-801.		
11	(c) The driver's license issued under subsection (a) of this section		
12	shall clearly display on its face the phrase "Not valid for federal		
13	identification purposes".		
14	(d) This section does not authorize the issuance of a commercial		
15	driver's license or commercial driver's learner's permit to a person who is		
16	not lawfully present in the United States.		
17	(e) The department may adopt rules necessary for the administration of		
18	this section.		
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
