Physician order for life-sustaining treatment form. 10 The State Board of Health shall prescribe a standardized physician 11 order for life-sustaining treatment form that: 12 (1) Is signed and dated by: 13 The patient or the legal representative of the 14 patient; and 15 The physician supervising healthcare provider or 16 physician extender of the patient; 17 Includes: (2) 18 (A) The name and date of birth of the patient; and 19 (B) The intentions of the patient regarding care, 20 including without limitation the administration of cardiopulmonary 21 resuscitation and the level of medical interventions in the event of a 22 medical emergency; and 23 (3) Is easily distinguishable to facilitate recognition by 24 healthcare providers and healthcare facilities. 25 (b) A legal representative may sign a physician order for lifesustaining treatment form on behalf of a patient who lacks capacity to do so, 26 27 guided by: 28 (1) The express or implied intentions of the patient; or 29 (2) If the intentions of the patient are unknown and cannot be 30 reasonably determined, the best interest of the patient given the overall 31 medical condition and prognosis of the patient. 32 The physician order for life-sustaining treatment form shall be completed by a physician supervising healthcare provider or physician 33 34 extender based upon current patient intentions and medical indications. 35 (2) During the process of completing the physician order for

life-sustaining treatment form, the physician may supervising healthcare

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l provider or physician extender should:

11	healthcare provider or physician extender to unilaterally create a physician	
12	order for life-sustaining treatment on behalf of an individual.	
13	(e) A supervising healthcare provider or physician extender who is	
14	acting in good faith and in accordance with generally accepted healthcare	
15	standards applicable to the healthcare provider or healthcare institution is	
16	not subject to civil or criminal liability or discipline for the creation of	
17	a physician order for life-sustaining treatment.	
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19	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-6-307 is amended to read as follows:	
20	20-6-307. Relationship with advance directives.	
21	(a) (l) A physician order for life sustaining treatment form is not	
22	intended to replace an advance directive.	
23	(2) In executing a physician order for life-sustaining treatment	
24	form, a patient, the legal representative of the patient when applicable, and	
25	the physician supervising healthcare provider or physician extender shall	
26	make a good-faith effort to locate and incorporate treatment preferences	
27	documented in a previously executed advance directive, when appropriate and	
28	desired by the patient to the extent that it is in the best interests of the	
29	patient.	
30	(b) In the event of a conflict with a physician order for life-	
31	sustaining treatment form and an advance directive, either:	
32	(1) The the document executed most recently by the patient shall	
33	take precedence regarding the medical decision or treatment preference at	
34	issue ; or	
35	(2) If both the advance directive and the physician order for	
36	life-sustaining treatment form were executed by the legal representative of	

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the patient, the advance directive shall take precedence regarding the medical decision or treatment preference at issue. (c) This section does not prohibit or require the execution, revocation, or modification of an advance directive If a conflict exists between the most recently executed document and an advance directive, the most recent document shall take precedence regarding the medical decision or treatment preference at issue. /s/M.
