7	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
8	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the current coronavirus 2019		
9	(COVID-19) pandemic has impacted the normal functioning of state government,		
10	including the procedures that will be used for the 2021 Regular Session; that		
11	the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic has required a change in the		
12	procedures usually implemented by the General Assembly during previous		
13	legislative sessions; that given the required changes to the normal		
14	legislative session procedures, the state government needs to retain		
15	experienced personnel in order to properly perform necessary legislative		
16	functions and adequately respond to issues that may arise during the 2021		
17	Regular Session; and that this act is necessary to ensure that the 2021		
18	Regular Session proceeds with minimal interruption or error. Therefore, an		
19	emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for		
20	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become		
21	effective on:		
22	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
23	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
24	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
25	bill; or		
26	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
27	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
