1	SECTION II. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
2	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the state has a severe
3	shortage of nurses and nurse educators, that for financial and other reasons
4	the state often has difficulty retaining state-educated nurses and nurse
5	educators after graduation for the state's workforce, and that this act is
6	immediately necessary to provide financial incentives to increase the number
7	of nurses and nurse educators in the state for the protection of the public
8	health, safety, and welfare. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and
9	this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
10	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
11	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
12	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
13	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
14	bill; or
15	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
16	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
