2	SECTION 2. Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's Disease in Arkansas
3	Created Membership.
4	(a) There is created the Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's
5	Disease in Arkansas to consist of seventeen (17) members as follows:
6	(1) Four (4) members appointed by the Speaker of the House of
7	Representatives as follows:
8	(A) One (1) member of the House of Representatives;
9	(B) One (1) member who has been diagnosed with Alzheimer's
10	disease;
11	(C) One (1) member to represent the health care provider
12	community; and
13	(D) One (1) member to represent the adult day services
14	<pre>industry;</pre>
15	(2) Four (4) members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
16	the Senate as follows:
17	(A) One (1) member of the Senate;
18	(B) One (1) member who is a paid caregiver of a person
19	with Alzheimer's disease;
20	(C) One (1) member to represent the assisted living
21	industry; and
22	(D) One (1) member who is a scientist who specializes in
23	Alzheimer's research;
24	(3) Four (4) members appointed by the Governor as follows:
25	(A) One (1) member who is a family member of a person
26	living with Alzheimer's disease or other form of dementia;
27	(B) One (1) member to represent the nursing facility
28	<pre>industry;</pre>
29	(C) One (1) member who is a person active in the state
30	chapter of the Alzheimer's Association; and
31	(D) One (1) member who is a person active in the state
32	chapter of Alzheimer's Arkansas Programs and Services; and
33	(4) Five (5) members as follows:
34	(A) The Director of the Department of Health or his or her
35	designee;
36	(B) The Director of the Department of Human Services or

1	his or her designee;
2	(C) The Director of the Division of Behavioral Health of
3	the Department of Human Services or his or her designee;
4	(D) The Director of the Arkansas Center for Health
5	Improvement or his or her designee; and
6	(E) The Director of the Department of Workforce Services
7	or his or her designee.
8	(b) The members of the task force shall be appointed by June 30, 2009.
9	(c)(1) Members of the task force shall serve at the pleasure of their
10	appointing authorities.
11	(2) A vacancy on the task force shall be filled by the original
12	appointing authority.
13	(d)(1) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President
14	Pro Tempore of the Senate shall each designate a co-chair from among the
15	members of the task force.
16	(2) The cochairs shall jointly call the first meeting of the
17	task force.
18	(e) A majority vote of the members present is required for any action
19	of the task force.
20	(f) Task force meetings shall be held in Pulaski County, Arkansas, and
21	at other locations in the state as the task force shall deem necessary.
22	(g) The Bureau of Legislative Research shall provide staff support to
23	the task force as necessary to assist the task force in the performance of
24	its duties.
25	(h) Legislative members of the task force shall be reimbursed for
26	expenses and per diem at the same rate and from the same source as provided
27	by law for members of the General Assembly attending meetings of the interim
28	<u>committees.</u>

30	SECTION 3. <u>Duties.</u>
31	(a) The Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's Disease in Arkansas
32	shall:
33	(1) Assess the current and future impact of Alzheimer's disease
34	and other types of dementia on the residents of the State of Arkansas;
35	(2) Examine the existing industries, services, and resources
36	addressing the needs of persons living with Alzheimer's disease their

1	families, and caregivers; and
2	(3) Develop a strategy to mobilize a state response to the
3	public health crisis created by Alzheimer's disease and other types of
4	dementia.
5	(b) The task force shall include the following in its assessments and
6	recommendations:
7	(1) Statewide trends in the number of persons living with
8	Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia and the needs of those
9	persons;
10	(2) The state's role in providing long-term care, family
11	caregiver support, and other forms of assistance to persons with early-stage
12	and younger onset of Alzheimer's disease;
13	(3) State policy regarding persons with Alzheimer's disease and
14	developmental disabilities;
15	(4) Existing services, resources, and capacity, including
16	without limitation:
17	(A) The type, cost, and availability of dementia services;
18	(B) The dementia-specific training requirements for long-
19	term care staff;
20	(C) Quality care measures for residential care facilities;
21	(D) The capacity of public safety and law enforcement
22	agencies to respond to persons with Alzheimer's disease;
23	(E) The availability of home-based and community-based
24	resources for persons with Alzheimer's disease, including the availability of
25	respite care for families;
26	(F) An inventory of long-term care dementia care units;
27	(G) The adequacy and appropriateness of geriatric-
28	psychiatric units for persons with behavioral disorders associated with
29	Alzheimer's and related dementia;
30	(H) The assisted living residential options for persons
31	with dementia; and
32	(I) State support for Alzheimer's research; and
33	(5) Needed state policies or responses, including without
34	<pre>limitation:</pre>
35	(A) Directions for the provision of clear and coordinated
36	services and supports for persons and families living with Alzheimer's and

1	related disorders; and
2	(B) Strategies for addressing identified gaps in services.
3	
4	SECTION 4. Reports.
5	(a) The Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's Disease in Arkansas
6	shall present a draft of assessments and recommendations for meeting the
7	Alzheimer's disease needs in the State of Arkansas to the House and Senate
8	Interim Committees on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor on or before October
9	<u>25, 2010</u> .
10	(b) The task force shall issue a final report of its assessments and
11	recommendations for meeting the Alzheimer's disease needs in the State of
12	Arkansas to the House and Senate Interim Committees on Public Health,
13	Welfare, and Labor and the Governor on or before January 15, 2011.
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15	SECTION 5. The Task Force on the Effect of Alzheimer's Disease in
16	Arkansas shall expire on January 15, 2011.
