SERVICE.

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**Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 150**

Amend Senate Bill No. 150 as engrossed, S2/6/19 (version: 02/06/2019 10:22:46 AM)

Add Representative Capp as a cosponsor of the bill

AND

Page 1, delete line 13, and substitute the following:  
"SERVICE; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

AND

Delete the subtitle in its entirety and substitute:

"TO AMEND THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS  
REGULATORY REFORM ACT OF 2013; TO PROVIDE  
ADDITIONAL ACCESS TO FEDERAL  
COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION-DEFINED  
BROADBAND SERVICE; AND TO DECLARE AN  
EMERGENCY."

AND

Page 2, delete lines 21 and 22, and substitute the following:  
"directly or indirectly, basic local exchange, voice, data, broadband, video,  
or wireless ~~telecommunication service~~ telecommunications services."

AND

Page 3, delete lines 14 through 17, and substitute the following:  
"(5) After reasonable notice to the public, a government"

AND



Page 3, delete line 24, and substitute the following:  
"telecommunications services to the public in the unserved areas.

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that reliable high speed broadband service is essential to a community's success; that reliable high speed broadband is not available in many rural areas of the state; and that this act is immediately necessary to expand the benefits of reliable high speed broadband to all residents of the state. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto."
