18 REMOVING PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE
19 FUNDING FROM FOUNDATION FUNDING AND TRANSFERRING
20 THAT OBLIGATION TO THE STATE OF ARKANSAS.

23 REQUESTING THAT THE HOUSE AND SENATE
24 INTERIM COMMITTEES ON EDUCATION STUDY
25 THE IMPACT OF REMOVING PUBLIC SCHOOL
26 EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE FUNDING FROM
27 FOUNDATION FUNDING AND TRANSFERRING THAT
28 OBLIGATION TO THE STATE OF ARKANSAS.

31 WHEREAS, foundation funding distributed to public school districts
32 throughout Arkansas currently includes a sum for the purpose of funding
33 employer contributions for public school employee health insurance; and

35 WHEREAS, public school districts and public school employees would
36 benefit from a study of whether funding employer contributions at the

1 district level is the most efficient funding method,

3 NOW THEREFORE,

4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-SIXTH GENERAL
5 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

7 THAT the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education study the
8 impact of removing school employee health insurance funding from foundation
9 funding and transferring that obligation to the State of Arkansas.

11 BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED that the House and Senate Interim Committees on
12 Education prepare a report detailing the results of the study on or before
13 May 1, 2008.
