Re: Arkansas Forestry Commission monthly activity report for February 2019

Dear Senator Teague and Representative Jean:

Per Section 42 of Act 841 of the 2018 Regular Session, the Arkansas Forestry Commission (AFC) is to report monthly fiscal and agency activities to the Arkansas Legislative Council or the Joint Budget Committee when the Legislature is in session. Please find attached the report for February 2019.

Representative Bruce Westerman visited the AFC Central Dispatch, Aviation Department and the District 5 Headquarters in February. The main reason for his visit was to witness the need for high speed internet in rural areas. AFC's Dispatch Center, a statewide, 24/7 manned asset, uses high tech tracking and dispatch programs to ensure crews are dispatched to emergency situations. These programs require high speed internet to operate correctly.

Representative Westerman also learned about the AFC's aviation program, fire detection, and the district fire suppression abilities.

Other personnel attending were the Mayor and County Judge of Malvern. All in attendance was impressed with AFC operations and understood the need for more and faster internet capabilities.

ARKANSAS FORESTRY COMMISSION February 2019 Activity and Fiscal Report

FIRE PROTECTION

Wildfires: During February a total of 14 wildfires were suppressed for a total of 85 acres burned. Ten-year average for the month of February is 161 wildfires for 2897 acres burned.

Storm Damage Assistance: An AFC crew assisted in clearing roads of storm debris using dozers and chainsaws. The roads cleared were located southeast of Yellville in Marion County.

An AFC ranger assisted in clearing storm debris from Highway 43 S in Boone County.

Rural Fire Protection: Rural Fire Protection (RFP) assists fire departments (FDs) with organization, training and equipment. RFP provides interest-free loans, secures firefighting and emergency service equipment from the federal government, and administers a federal grant to assist approximately 1,000 fire departments. The RFP shop provides maintenance to property destined for FDs and repairs AFC equipment.

February 2019

- 88 fire departments, (227 firefighters), were provided wildland fire training, 23 minority departments and three AFC/AAD personnel were in attendance.
- RFP received six brush trucks (valued at \$852,792.00), two generators (valued at \$35,773.00), a 1995 forklift (valued at \$23,350.00) and a 2012 side by side (valued at \$11,810.15).
- There were seven Department of Defense (DOD) vehicles, two Freightliners (valued at \$237,055.00), five brush trucks (valued at \$598,142.00) and one generator (valued at \$23,738.00) issued to FDs.
- 778 DOD Recycling Control Point (RCP) items were received for redistribution to FDs and AFC (valued at \$72,282.72) to include, heating blankets, medic bags, spine boards, hose assemblies, stethoscopes, and nomex face shields.
- The RFP shop completed maintenance on 13 AFC vehicles and equipment as well as five DOD vehicles.

• RFP provided three interest free loans via the Rural Fire Revolving Loan Fund.

 2018 VFA Grant: PO was issued for remaining PPE order. We still expect delivery sometime in the latter part of March. Funds were available for two additional kits and items have been ordered.

Firewise: Firewise staff and district personnel work with fire departments and civic organizations to make communities safer from the threat of wildfire through mitigation projects and community education initiatives. Arkansas has 82 active Firewise communities. Recognized communities display Firewise signs at the city limits.

Firewise achieved the following in **February**:

- Delivered one Initial Training.
- Delivered one Risk Assessment Training.
- Assisted one community with re-assessment paperwork and grant application.
- Met with three communities to discuss returning to the program.
- Presented program update at District Forester's Meeting.
- Assisted one community with paperwork.
- Delivered program overview and update to D7 personnel.

Law Enforcement: AAD has the authority to enforce the laws of the State of Arkansas, but primarily on unlawful dumping, timber theft, forest fires, and forestry equipment theft and focuses vandalism. AAD aggressively seeks prosecution of violators to deter such crimes. AAD Investigators and district law enforcement officers opened four dumping and ten timber theft cases. They closed three dumping, six fire related and six timber theft cases.

FOREST MANAGEMENT

Forest Stewardship/Rural Forestry Assistance Programs: AFC works with a diverse group of partners and professionals to conserve, protect, and enhance Arkansas's forests. The Forest Stewardship Program (FSP) is an opportunity for non-industrial private forest landowners who are interested in managing their property for wildlife, recreation, soil and water conservation, agro-forestry and\or for timber production to get a comprehensive multiple use forest management plan that is prepared by private consulting or AFC foresters, private consulting or AGFC private lands wildlife biologists, and USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service soil and water professionals. Arkansas has 397,403 acres of private land actively enrolled in the Forest Stewardship Program. Landowners that implement practices under their FSP management plans become Certified Forest Stewards. There are 1,240 Forest Stewards owning 278,067 acres in the State.

For February, 14 FSP plans were prepared on 765 acres. In addition, AFC personnel provide technical assistance through the rural forestry program to landowners that are enrolled in USDA tree planting and forest management programs such as the Conservation Reserve Program, Environmental Quality Incentives Program, Wetland Reserve Program, and AFC Southern Pine Beetle Prevention and Restoration Program. AFC foresters prepared 31 forest management practice plans on 2,969 acres. AFC personnel conducted two prescribed burns on 84 acres.

Forest Health: The Forest Health Specialist assists AFC personnel statewide in efforts to maintain healthy, productive forest ecosystems by preventing, detecting, monitoring, and suppressing damaging insects and diseases. AFC offers technical assistance to landowners who encounter forest health issues.

- AFC partnered with Arkansas Game and Fish Commission to restore native flowering plants to the Poison Springs State Forest. **Pollinator friendly plants** were seeded into various openings on the state forest. The restoration target is 20 acres.
- Staff represented all southeastern state forestry agencies at the Management Team Meeting of the **Forest Health Monitoring Program**. The team decides program direction for this national program funded by the Forest Service.
- **Southern pine beetle** traps were set up in southern Arkansas during the last week of February. These traps will provide an early warning if SPB abundance increases.
- Staff trained approximately 15 people to identify **southern pine beetle**.

Urban Forestry Assistance: Urban Forestry Program staff provides assistance and training to communities, educational institutions, non-profit organizations, developers and homeowners on urban tree care, inventory and management.

February 2019

- Reviewed Tree City USA applications and assisted several communities with the recertification process.
- Attended the Municipal Forestry Institute in Oregon, an intensive training covering leadership, program administration, coalition building, strategic thinking, program planning, and public relations in community forestry.
- Provided Master Gardener training on pruning trees in Hot Springs.
- Planned state Arbor Day celebration and certified arborist training workshop in conjunction with AR Urban Forestry Council.
- Wrote article for the AR Municipal League City & Town magazine about the Tree Streets organization.

Reforestation: AFC's tree improvement program strives to provide landowners with the highest possible genetic gain in pine and hardwood seed. One method AFC employs to achieve this objective is by establishing the highest genetic gain material in our newest pine and hardwood seed orchards. AFC Baucum Nursery then makes available to landowners the improved varieties of pine and hardwood, which are the net result of the tree improvement program.

With assistance from District 4, Reforestation Manager collected 10 year progeny data from 780 loblolly pine trees at David Barr test site which is about 5 miles south of Bodcaw.

Reforestation Manager, Administrative Assistant, Nursery Manager and Reforestation Foreman for Tree Improvement attended the AFC midyear check in meeting on February 14 at the U of A Cooperative Extension Service State Office.

Baucum Nursery: AFC's Baucum Nursery produces hardwood and pine seedlings for reforestation and afforestation efforts.

Year to date through February 28th, there were 629 online orders and 130 traditional orders. Total sales of 1,137,275 pine and 5,943,600 hardwood.

Comparatively, in the same period in FY 18, there were 714 online orders and 166 traditional orders. Total sales of 1,391,050 pine and 5,132,900 hardwood.

Tree Improvement:

During the month of February, the Bluff City Tree Improvement staff completed the following:

- Finished planting grafts in production orchards
- Collected scion material for grafting
- Flagged test at Hope Experiment Station
- Boxed and delivered 18,900 containerized 3-star loblolly pine to Baucum
- Made seedling deliveries for Baucum to AFC coolers in Stamps and El Dorado
- Grafted 325 pine
- Top grafted (about 20 ft. from the ground) in orchard 1719 on 40 trees. These top grafts are done as a shortcut process to change the clone in a particular position.

• Planted test at Hope, approximately 1,800 seedlings on 10ft x 10ft spacing. This test is a growth and yield study of containerized vs bare root loblolly pine seedlings.

Best Management Practices: AFC provides BMP training to loggers and timber companies, conducts courtesy exams prior or during timber harvest operations and addresses logging complaints.

BMP achieved the following in **February 2019**:

- Inspected Fulton County complaint, found to be valid, prepared and submitted report.
- Received complaint from Izard County, found to be invalid, referred back to Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ).
- Inspected Polk County complaint, found to be valid, prepared and submitted report.
- Strategic Plan update on BMP section.
- Meeting for Unit/Program Managers mid-year period.

Forest Inventory and Analysis (FIA): AFC in cooperation with USDA Forest Service Southern Research Station is responsible for collecting scientific data from permanently established plots located all over the state. The plots, each representing 5,937 acres, are strategically located on a three-mile by three-mile grid. The inventory plots have been generating data since they were established in the 1950's. Natural resource managers use the data to make management decisions and follow Arkansas' natural resource trends through time.

FIA completed 48 plots during the month of February. Inventory 2018 is now 100% complete. Field work on the 2019 Inventory will begin in March.
