Please add the following section, renumber the sections accordingly, and amend the emergency clause:

SECTION (X.) APPROPRIATION -UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS AND EXPENSES - CASH. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Commerce, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801, for unemployment benefit payments and other expenses including, disaster relief payments, training allowances, payments to participant contractors and Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund loan repayments by the Department of Commerce - Division of Workforce Services - Unemployment Benefits and Expenses - Cash for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the following: ITEM FISCAL YEAR NO. 2019-2020 (01) FEDERAL EMPLOYEES BENEFITS PAYMENTS \$1,070,000,000 (02) U I BENEFITS – TAXABLE EMPLOYERS 300,000,000 TOTAL AMOUNT APPROPRIATED \$1,370,000,000

This request is necessary to ensure that the state has sufficient appropriation to support the processing and payment of unemployment benefit payments to Arkansas citizens who have been impacted by the 2020 Public Health Emergency.
