Act 38 of 1989 established the Arkansas Tourism Development Trust Fund, in effect a 2% lodging tax designed to promote and expand Arkansas's tourism industry. To say that it's produced positive results would be a serious understatement. In the last decade alone, our state's tourists have contributed over \$3 billion to the state's general fund – tax dollars which have helped keep public school doors open and prison doors locked. I cannot imagine how Arkansas's budget could have been balanced without this revenue.

As you know, we invest the trust fund deposits in research-based promotional campaigns aimed at key audiences in markets primarily within a day's drive of the state borders. The combination of conservative revenue projections and excellent returns on our advertising programs has resulted in a substantial surplus in the trust fund. I'm asking for your approval of a supplemental appropriation which would allow us to put these additional funds to work for Arkansas's taxpayers.

The proposal involves five specific recommendations:

1) Research: To better understand the needs and expectations of Arkansas's potential customers and the efficacy of our campaigns, the Department must expand its research capabilities. In particular we wish to update the state's economic impact analysis and add a program to evaluate and quantify the results of our marketing efforts. For the economic impact analysis, we would like to develop a Tourism Satellite Account to more accurately assess the impact of tourism on the state and county economies, as well as to measure the industry's indirect and induced spending. The marketing evaluation research program we propose will provide critical information to guide actions to insure we are moving the Arkansas brand in the right direction among the right audiences. The Department firmly believes that data should drive decisions.

Requested amount: \$125,000

2) Retirement/relocation: With our fortunate combination of reasonable taxes, four-season climate, competitive cost-of-living, convenient location, and great quality of life, Arkansas is uniquely positioned to take advantage of the growth of Baby Boomer retirees. Convincing them to bring their time, talents, and trust funds to The Natural State will require a major commitment of resources, particularly in the field of social media.

Requested amount: \$500,000

3) War Memorial Stadium: Placement of this historic structure under Parks and Tourism will create intriguing challenges for Department's staff. However, I'm pleased to report my colleagues are eager to take on this new responsibility, sharing their marketing and management experiences with the team already in place at the stadium. Updating the website and pursuing a wide range of social media opportunities will be our priorities.

Requested amount: \$250,000

4) International promotion: In the past, the Department has never pursued the international traveler, primarily for two reasons: limited funding and a lack of world-class attractions. However, with the opening of Little Rock's Clinton Presidential Center, the Crystal Bridges Muscum of American Art in Bentonville, and the Johnny Cash Boyhood Home in Dyess, one of those barriers is no longer a factor. In fact, we've seen a good deal of interest at recent marketplaces from foreign tour operators wanting to bring their clients to Arkansas. My recommendation is to begin with three markets: the United Kingdom, Australia, and Italy. We share a common language with the U.K. and Australia and access is fairly convenient for both. As for Italy, we've developed close ties with an Italian travel professional who's already done a great deal of work promoting the state as a motorcycling destination to her constituents. While establishing productive relationships overseas will require both money and patience, I'm convinced the timing is finally right for Arkansas to enter this arena.

Requested amount: \$350,000

5) Expanded domestic promotion: As you know, we'll begin a new era for Arkansas tourism on July 1, 2017, with a single advertising/marketing agency working in our behalf. I'm very excited about the future and feel that the Department, working with an aggressive and creative outside team, can make significant strides in the months to come. My recommendation is to reserve the additional funds for targeted social media campaigns aimed at key niche audiences (such as mountain bikers, motorcyclists, and music fans).

Requested amount: \$500,000

Total supplemental request:

\$1,725,000

I look forward to visiting with you in more detail regarding this suggestion. Arkansas tourism has compiled a great record in recent years, and these additional funds – already collected and in the State Treasury – can be reinvested to carry our momentum forward.

- 26 2017 through June 30, 2017 2018.

- 28 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
- 29 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
- 30 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
- 31 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
- 32 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
- 33 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
- 34 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
- 35 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
- 36 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

2	SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
3	Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
4	contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
5	which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
6	Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
7	manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
8	summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
9	Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
10	
11	SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
12	General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
13	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
14	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2017 is essential to the operation of
15	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
16	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
17	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2017 could work irreparable harm
18	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
19	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
20	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
21	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2017.
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
