Explanation: On September 27, 2012, eighteen (18) portraits were wrongfully taken from me during a shakedown. (See Exhibit A). Only ten (10) were recorded because the officer who took them miscounted and would not discuss the issue with me when he ordered me to sign the confiscation form. The drawings were pencil and ink on white paper size 8 1/2 x 11. They were confiscated as "illegal hobbycraft drawings", however, nothing about them qualify as such. In fact, ADC has repeatedly encouraged inmates to do such drawings by having competitions for such drawings. (See Exhibits B and C). Following instructions from appropriate ADC staff, I made several attempts to get the drawings back to send home. Finally, I was told to contact Mr. James who did not respond to my request. Nine (9) days later I filed a grievance that was rejected as untimely though policy allows fifteen (15) days to file a grievance. (See Exhibits D, E, and F.)

MOTION TO DISMISS

COMES NOW the Respondent, Arkansas Department of Correction, and for its Motion to Dismiss states as follows:

1. On September 27, 2012, 10 pages of plastic sheet protectors containing pen and ink drawings and other items were confiscated from Claimant and destroyed. He seeks \$9,000.00 in damages. Claimant has failed to state a cause of action under ARCP Rule 12(b)(6) and the claim should be dismissed.
2. Claimant alleges the items were nothing more than what is allowed and encouraged by the Respondent when requesting inmates to participate in drawing contests sponsored by the agency. These contests are for pen OR ink drawings which clearly opens them up to all inmates who do not have a hobbycraft card. However, Claimant overlooks the fact that his drawings, whether there were 10 or 18, were contained in plastic sheet protectors which rendered all of them contraband. See Exhibit "A". Plastic sheet protectors are not sold on the commissary and Claimant had no authority to be in possession of them and no right to have them returned.
3. Contraband is defined by the ADC in AD 08-14 to mean "any item or items determined by the Board of Corrections or ADC to jeopardize the safety, security, or good order of its institutions, including but not limited to the following...articles in excess of established facility limits, articles that have been altered or used for unauthorized purposes, and/or articles in an inmate's possession in an unauthorized area; unauthorized articles seized during a search of living quarters, place of assignment, vehicle or personal search, items which are illegal or banned by policies.
4. Therefore, if the items are contraband, the Claimant has failed to state a claim upon which relief can be granted under ARCP 12(B)(6) and Respondent requests that the matter be dismissed.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons submitted above, Respondent requests that the matter be dismissed.

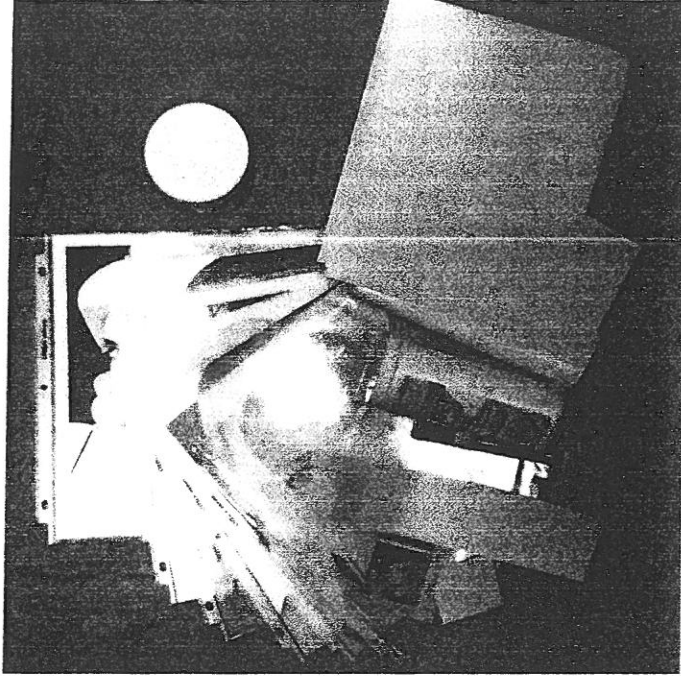

Response to Motion to Dismiss

Comes now the claimant, Lance Owens, and for his Response to Respondent's Motion to Dismiss, states :

1. Respondent contends that because Mr. Owens' drawings were placed in clear plastic sheet protectors that the drawings became contraband. Policy does not support this contention and, practice demonstrates otherwise as well.
2. Administrative Directive (AD) 11-24 superceeds AD 08-14 and provides the controlling definition for contraband. No-where in either definition does the language change non--contraband items to contraband because of their placement

among contraband items.

3. It's a well established legal principle that practice makes policy. The Department of Correction routinely confiscates contraband items from inmates. During these confiscations it's common practice for the confiscating officer to remove all other items from the contraband and only confiscate the contraband. (See attached Exhibits A, B, C, D, and E.) The evidence illustrates that this practice is taught to officers in their initial training. (See Exhibit A).

4. During the shakedown in which Mr. Owens' drawings were confiscated, two (2) "empty" containers were taken because containers are considered as contraband. (See Exhibit A of Complaint). Those contraband containers, however, were not empty until the contents were emptied out by the officers who confiscated the drawings. (See Exhibits F, and G). With the exception of one (1) highlighter, Mr. Owens was allowed to keep all the items removed from the containers. (Highlighters are contraband.)

5. Respondent admits taking Mr. Owens' drawings. Respondent further admits that such drawings are permitted by all inmates.

6. Respondent's attempt to distort the rigid definition of contraband to include Mr. Owens' drawings fails. Because

the drawings are not contraband Mr. Owens has stated a claim for which relief can be granted. Therefore, the Respondent's motion should be denied.

Wherefore, for the reasons stated herein, Mr. Owens request that the Motion to Dismiss be denied.

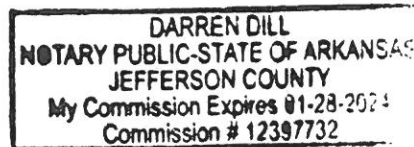

During the shakedown, I also witnessed the officers conducting the shakedown empty out two plastic containers that had pens, pencils and cotton swabs. The officers did not confiscate the contents but they did confiscate the plastic containers themselves because they were contraband.

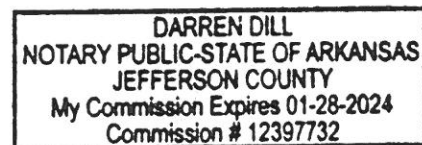

MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Comes now the claimant, Lance Owens, and for his motion for reconsideration, states :

1. On June 12, 2014, this Commission granted Respondent's motion to dismiss the instant case ;
2. The Commission's decision was based upon Respondent's assertion that the property in question was confiscated as contraband because the property was in clear plastic sheet protectors which Respondent alleges are contraband;
3. Clear plastic sheet protectors were not regarded as contraband prior to the confiscation of Mr. Owens' drawings and, have not been treated as contraband since ;
4. The clear plastic sheet protectors in question were pre-approved

by ADC staff and were given to Mr. Owens by ADC staff members who were responsible for removing all contraband from an inmates possession;

5. Mr. Owens' pencil and ink drawings were taken as "illegal hobby craft drawings" and not because of clear plastic sheet protectors. The evidence shows only one (1) clear plastic sheet protector was recorded as confiscated and, that the pencil and ink drawings are not illegal hobby craft drawings; and
6. Even if the clear plastic sheet protectors had not been permitted by Respondent, the drawings were not part of the sheet protectors and, as the evidence shows, had the confiscation been about clear plastic sheet protectors the drawings would not have been taken.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons set out herein, Mr. Owens respectfully ask this Commission to reconsider its Findings and grant him a hearing in this matter.
