My name is Johnny Brown. I am 63 years old. I own three businesses in Pope County.

First I would like to thank you for your service and the job you do. Seems like now days little respect or gratitude is given but I appreciate hard work so again, thanks.

I have lived in Pope County for about 48 yrs. Jim Gibson, our County Judge that just retired was the best Judge we have ever had in my opinion. I can honestly say I can not remember one time anyone had a negative thing to say about him either in person or in the press. We have enjoyed low tax rates along with excellent county services. Judge Gibson did not run for re-election, he retired. Mayor Randy Horton was a great Mayor and did lose his re-election bid.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment. I am a resident of Pope County.

The following are my comments concerning RULE 2.

2.0 (Definitions)

I would recommend adding "Letter of Support" to the list of definitions. As a minimum, that letter should provide guidance as to the content to include:

- A clear, concise statement of support/endorsement,
- Rationale for decisions favoring one casino over other competitors including the disclosure of any specific proposals made by casinos that may have affected the decision.
- I would also suggest that "Resolution" (in reference to the Quorum Court) to be defined with direction as to what needs to be addressed in the resolution.

4.(b)

General comment:

It is hard to discern in either a reading of Amendment 100 or this rule (that mirrors the Amendment) exactly what role the Quorum Court has in the decision-making process regarding a proposed casino. Under what circumstances would a Quorum Court's Resolution be used "in lieu" of a CountyJudge's Letter of Support?

The wording in Amendment 100 identifying the County Judge as the sole decision-maker in authoring the "Letter of Support" may overstep the executive powers identified in Amendment 55 effectively excluding the Quorum Court by use of the word "or" (versus "and").

It seems reasonable that the writers of Amendment 100 intended for there to be Quorum Court involvement and concurrence.

Perhaps the Attorney General's office or legislature could provide a clearer interpretation of this part of the law and provide the Racing Commission with some additional direction as it relates to this question. It seems likely the intent of the legislation was to include the Quorum Court as legitimate partners in the decision making process.

On a positive note, I strongly agree with the proposed rule as found in paragraph 2.13.4(b) which directly affects both Pope and Jefferson Counties. This paragraph requires a casino applicant to have a letter of support from a current county judge or Quorum Court (and mayor if needed). This part of Rule 2 is fair, clear, and makes perfect common sense.

Again, I appreciate the Racing Commission's work in this rule-making effort and its leadership particularly in light of this new law and the controversy in Pope County.

Regarding the public comment period of proposed Casino Gaming Rules & Regulations, I would like to make the following comments:

1. The proposed and published language of Rule 2 [2.13.4(b)] is exactly as it should be, and I am in full support of.

RULE 2.13.4(b) "All casino applicants for a casino license in Pope County and Jefferson County are required to submit either a letter of support from the county judge or a resolution from the quorum court in the county where the proposed casino is to be located and, if the proposed casino is to be located within a city or town, are also required to submit a letter of support from the mayor in the city or town where the casino applicant is proposing the casino to be located. All letters of support or resolutions by the Quorum Court, required by these Rules and the Amendment, shall be dated and signed by the County Judge, Quorum Court members, or Mayor holding office at the time of the submission of an application for a casino gaming license."

- 2. The voters of Pope County spoke very clear on November 6th regarding our community's intent of casino garning and a local control ordinance. The Pope County Ordinance, passed by 68% of county voters in the November election, which states that voters of Pope County shall vote by an election in support of a casino applicant before any letter of support can be written by a currently elected County Judge or Quorum Court.
- 3. With this email, I have attached 3 important and pertinent items related to a casino in Pope County: A resolution from the Pope County Quorum Court; A resolution from the Russellville City Council; A local news article from previous County Judge regarding his opinion and intention of a letter his office issues prior to the end of 2018. It is very clear that both governing bodies, the county and the city, were not in favor of a local casino without a binding vote of the local residents. It is also clear that the previous County Judge that issued 'a letter' made a public declaration that the intent of his letter was not to be considered a letter of support as required in the Casino Amendment and therefore should not be considered as such by anyone.

My name is Johnny Brown. I am 63 years old. I own three businesses in Pope County. I am not a gambler. My family has lived in Pope County for decades.

First I would to say thank you for taking time to read this and for the hard work that you do on behalf of the citizens of Arkansas. I realize that the decisions you make are sometimes hard and that people can be harsh. Having said that I would like to respectfully submit some thoughts concerning having a Casino and who decides it in Pope County.

Jim Gibson was the best County Judge we ever had to my recollection. Our real estate taxes are some of the lowest in the State yet we have enjoyed excellent County services under his administration. I cannot, recall one single complaint or issue ever being brought up about the way he did his job, ever. I know that he spent a lot of time weighing what would be right for Pope County concerning having a casino here. Mr Gibson considered the various casino operators and recommended Gulfside because of what they had to offer to the community and the fact that they would enhance rather than hurt the county. His decision was not made off the cuff nor taken lightly because in this, just like all the decisions he had made for the county in the past, he wanted to do what was best for the residents.

I lived in Oklahoma 45 years ago, still have family there. The Cherokee and Quapaw casinos, I am told, contribute little if anything other than an occasional token contribution for a bridge or whatever. My family there had nothing positive to say about them. Gulfside is different. It is my understanding that they intend to do as much business locally as possible. They are offering a million dollar a year scholarship for education, they have said that there would only be a small amount of Casino hotel rooms and restaurants so that they would not compete with the ones here now. I even heard they were planning to run a shuttle from the casino to downtown Russellville so people could eat at local restaurants and visit local stores etc without having to deal with parking and so forth. I was told the Superintendent of Russellville Schools contacted the Gulfport School Superintendent and was told that if we got a chance to get Gulfside, to do it. That they had helped the school there tremendously.

Thanks to the minimum wage law passing we will have no new growth in this State in my opinion, especially in Russellville. So the casino jobs would are even more important plus all the growth that would stem from tourism. I see no negative to Gulfside but I do the Indian casinos. One will better our county, the other will bring nothing in my humble opinion and I think that is what Judge Gibson decided.

Judge Gibson did not run for re-election. had he done so, I am sure he would have easily won. We now have a judge that has no experience as a judge. I was told Gulfside could bring in approx. 6 million a year in revenue for the county.

Laiso heard our New Judge wants to raise our millage rate. Old Judge was trying to keep our County solvent without raising taxes, new one wants to raise them instead of helping bring in millions of new revenue. Who sounds the smartest? 

There has been some controversy since Judge Jim Ed Gibson's "letter" to the state racing commission was sent in support of Gulfside Casino Partnership as to whether it was meant to satisfy the requirement set forth by the new Arkansas constitutional amendment allowing casinos in four Arkansas counties. Issue four required "either a letter of support from the county judge or a resolution from the county quorum court in the county where the casino would be located and, if the proposed casino is to be located within a city, a letter of support from the mayor of that city."

RVN was able to visit with Judge Gibson to get clarification as to what he meant the letter to be, why he felt going against the county ordinance enacted by a vote of the people, and why it was important he issue his letter before leaving office. Read his thoughts below:

RVN: There has been some debate as to the intent of the letter. Was it intended to be THE letter of support that was asked for?



Gibson: No. The letter I sent was 1 sentence long. And that's why we put "IF a casino license is granted" in the letter.

RVN: I think that's why there was some debate about it, because people have said, well he's saying "if", so it's not the letter that's needed. So, I just wanted to get your perspective on what the intent was. So, it wasn't necessarily meant as THE letter of support?

Gibson: No, it wasn't.



RVN: Why go against the ordinance?

Gibson: Well, I've been told that the ordinance is not binding. And this is a multi-million dollar investment that's going to be made in the county & we want to make sure that the right people are in place.

RVN: So, what was the main factor in offering the support with a letter "if" a license is awarded? What made you disregard the ordinance? Did you think it just wasn't binding?
