Please approve the request to transfer Appropriations based on our Act 280 in Section 20, Transfer of Appropriation.

The Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA) Program makes use of federal funding to provide an array of services to workers separated from their jobs due to foreign trade. While most of the costs of these services center on occupational training and associated training costs, such as participant travel assistance, the TAA Program can also assist in the cost of job search efforts and the cost of relocation when a program participant must move in order to accept new employment. In addition, the TAA program provides wage subsidy assistance to qualified employers when a participant enters into a TAA Program approved and employer provided "on the job training" (OJT) program. The use of these federal funds is critical for the TAA Program

staff in Arkansas to continue to provide assistance to eligible dislocated workers in occupational training, related job search and, if needed, relocation allowances for the purpose of returning these workers to the workforce.

The TAA Program in Arkansas has continued to experience a steady increase in program related benefits costs primarily due to increased costs of training provider tuition, fees, approved supply items for training, and associated participant travel costs.

This request for a transfer of appropriation is due to these increased program related benefits of Travel Allowance & Payments to Participant Contractors in our TAA program.

The increase in Travel Allowance is due to Arkansas receiving approval from the U.S. Department of Labor of Travel Stipend Modifications. The mileage requirement for receipt of a Travel stipend was reduced from 50 miles oneway to 10 miles one-way.

The Trade Adjustment Assistance Program frequently enters into contracts with schools in order to pay for training that has been approved under the program. Approved training must consist of scheduled classroom training. The increase of payments to participant contractors is due to the increase cost of tuition, fees, tools and books required by the school and the cost of required supplies appropriate for students in this program. Books and tools must be on the official school required list for approval of purchase.
