Amend Senate Bill No. 209 as engrossed, S3/2/15 (version: 03/02/2015 03:30:20 PM)

Immediately following Section 29, insert a new section to read as follows:

" SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MORO BAY FUND TRANSFER. The Department of Parks and Tourism shall transfer the first fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) of revenue generated from the Moro Bay Cabins located at Moro Bay State Park to the Ouachita River Waterways Project Trust Fund to be used exclusively for expenses associated with the Ouachita River Commission.

It is the intent of the General Assembly and shall be monitored by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State that the funding provided in this Section shall not supplant any existing or budgeted revenues."

23 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - STIPENDS PAYMENTS. There is hereby
24 appropriated, to the Arkansas Department of Emergency Management, to be

30 SECTION 2. CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 25-16-904, concerning the
31 Stipend - Authorization for \$85, is amended to read as follows:

32 Each of the following state boards, by a majority vote of the total
33 membership of the board cast during its first regularly scheduled meeting of
34 each calendar year, may authorize payment to its members of a stipend not to
35 exceed eighty-five dollars (\$85.00) per day for each meeting, examination,
36 evaluation, or inspection attended or for any day while performing any proper

5 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
6 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
7 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
8 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
9 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
10 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
11 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
12 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

13
14 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
15 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
16 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
17 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2015 is essential to the operation of
18 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
19 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
20 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2015 could work irreparable harm
21 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
22 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
23 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
24 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2015.
