# K-12 Teacher Salaries

**2022 ADEQUACY STUDY**

Prepared for the Interim Senate Committee on Education and the Interim House Committee on Education

















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### Introduction

During the *Lake View* lawsuit, the courts cited Arkansas's comparatively low teacher salaries and wide wage disparities among districts in the state. In compliance with adequacy study requirements for the House and Senate Education Committees found in Ark. Code Ann. § 10-3-2101 et seq., this report seeks to evaluate the following issues regarding Arkansas teacher salaries:

- 1. How Arkansas teacher salaries compare with surrounding states and states of the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB).
- 2. How Arkansas's' average teacher salaries have changed in comparison with surrounding states and states in the SREB from 2019 to 2020.
- 3. How the cost of living in Arkansas and surrounding states affect the value of Arkansas teacher salaries.
- 4. Whether the disparity in teacher salaries within Arkansas increased or decreased in 2020-21.
- 5. How teacher salaries in Arkansas compare with the salaries in other professions with similar educational requirements within the state.

## **Teacher Salary Comparisons**

#### **AVERAGE TEACHER SALARIES**

According to the annual statistical report of the National Education Association (NEA), *Rankings of the States 2020 and Estimates of School Statistics 2021*, Arkansas's 2020 average salary ranked 47<sup>th</sup> among the fifty states and the District of Columbia (D.C.), which is a drop from Arkansas's prior year, 2019, ranking of 46<sup>th</sup>. As reported in the previous Teacher Salary Report, Arkansas's 2018 average salary ranked 44<sup>th</sup>. Arkansas's ranking compared to other states has steady declined in recent years.

The national average teacher salary for 2020 was \$64,133, which is an increase of 2.9% over the 2019 average salary. Arkansas's average salary of \$50,546 increased by 2.1%. New York, California, Massachusetts, and the District of Columbia rank 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>, respectively, among the 50 states and D.C. According to the 2020 Missouri Cost of Living Data Series index, these four states are also among the states with the highest cost of living in the U.S., so it is not unexpected that their teacher salaries would reflect this higher cost of living.<sup>1</sup>

To provide a better idea of the value of Arkansas's teacher salaries in light of the cost of living in Arkansas, the Bureau of Legislative Research (BLR) adjusted the teacher salaries of all 50 states and D.C. using the *Missouri Cost of Living Data Series* index. Using cost of living adjusted (COLA) salaries, Arkansas moves up in the national ranking to 28<sup>th</sup>. Arkansas's COLA-adjusted average salary ranking in 2018 and 2019 was 22<sup>nd</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>, respectively. Again, even with the COLA adjustments, we see a decline in Arkansas's average teacher salary ranking among the 50 states and D.C. in the most recently completed year.

#### Southern Regional Educational Board (SREB) States

The regional average teacher salary for 2020 was \$55,205. According to the SREB, the average teacher salary in the South is 16% lower than the national average.<sup>2</sup>

Arkansas's 2020 average teacher salary as reported by the NEA for state-to-state comparisons was \$50,456, which ranked 13<sup>th</sup> among the 16 SREB states, but rose to 9<sup>th</sup> when a cost of living adjustment was applied to the salaries. Arkansas's 2020 average salary, and COLA-adjusted rankings among the SREB states did not change from the prior year. The table below provides the 2020 NEA average salary, COLA-adjusted average salary, and rank using the COLA-adjusted salary, for each SREB state.

#### **Contiguous States**

The surrounding states' average teacher salary for 2020 was \$51,819. Among the seven surrounding states, Arkansas's 2020 unadjusted average salary ranked 6<sup>th</sup>, which is the same as it was in 2019, but is a decline from the 2018 ranking of 5<sup>th</sup>, and 2017 ranking of 4<sup>th</sup>. When a cost of living adjustment was applied, Arkansas's ranking moved up to 4<sup>th</sup>. The table to the right provides the 2020 NEA average salary, COLA-adjusted average salary,

# **Teacher Salary Disparity within Arkansas**

To assist in the evaluation of whether there is disparity in teacher salaries in Arkansas, the following sections present information regarding the state-level average teacher salaries and average teacher salaries by district and open-enrollment public charter school system.

The NEA average salary amounts are not available at the district levels, so the BLR used data from Arkansas Public School Computer Network (APSCN), to calculate an average salary for all districts and an overall statewide average based on the same methodology. Prior to the 2018 Adequacy Study, the Bureau used the Average Salary - Non-Federal Licensed Classroom full-time equivalents' (FTEs) from the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education's Annual Statistical Report (ASR) in its analysis of average teacher salary by school district. During that period of time, the BLR developed its own methodology of calculating average teacher salaries as a way of testing the reasonableness of the ASR data and as a way of producing a detailed report of the salary and FTE amounts for each teacher entering into the district average salary computation. Over the course of several years, material errors have been found in a limited number of districts in each ASR reviewed by the BLR. These errors have not had a significant impact on the overall state average, but have posed problems for the BLR's analysis. Beginning with the 2018 Adequacy Study, the BLR began using the average salaries from its own methodology for the Adequacy Study analysis, rather than using the salaries reported in the ASR. The average classroom teacher salaries for the 2021 school year and for all years showing a trend analysis presented in this report are from the BLR's methodology. This methodology is described in more detail in Appendix A.

The Arkansas Legislature created the Teacher Salary Equalization Fund<sup>3</sup> to assist in addressing the disparities in teacher salaries within the state and compared to surrounding states.<sup>4</sup> These funds provide public school districts and open-enrollment public charter school systems<sup>5</sup> with additional funding dedicated to increasing teacher salaries. Equalization funding is provided to districts and charter school systems that have an average annual teacher salary below the "statewide target average annual salary" set by the legislature.<sup>6</sup> This target average is a statewide measure, not an expectation for each district or charter school system. Equalization funding is continuous and will increase if Average Daily Membership (ADM) increases. The legislature may also increase the state target average and the amount of per-student funding as part of the adequacy review process, which will increase the amount of funds districts and charter school systems will be eligible to receive. Funding will not decrease below the amount received in the initial base year even if ADM decreases.

The goals of the legislature in providing equalization funding include<sup>7</sup>:

- o Regular increases in the state average salary;
- o An improved state ranking for average salary among SREB states;
- A continuous reduction in the gap between the highest and lowest average salary and starting salary in the state;



- Lowering the rates of teacher attrition, and
- Increasing the number of districts with a starting salary above the minimum required by statute.

According to the Arkansas Division of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), districts and open-enrollment charter school systems should use equalization funds, at a minimum, to meet or exceed the state minimum salary requirements in Ark. Code Ann. 6-17-2403 each year.<sup>8</sup>

The chart below provides public school districts' and open-enrollment public charter school system's average teacher salaries compared to the teacher salary amounts used in the matrix between 2017 and 2021. The teacher salary amount used in the matrix to calculate foundation funding has consistently been higher than the average teacher salary paid at the district and charter school system level.


# 5-YR Charter School Systems' and Districts' Average Salaries Compared to Matrix



The following chart compares average salaries at the school level (not at the district and charter system level as is shown above) within each of set of categories. Salary information was not available in the Arkansas Public School Computer Network (APSCN) from three charter schools: Creative Action Team (Hope School District), Polk Virtual Academy (Mena School District), and Adventure Online Academy (Waldron School District). As the chart illustrates, average teacher salaries are generally larger at schools within districts than at schools within charter systems. Salary levels generally grew at schools within increasingly larger districts, and Successful Schools had an average salary about \$500 higher than other schools' average salaries.



#### PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS' AVERAGE TEACHER SALARIES

The following chart provides the average teacher salary amounts for school districts between 2017 and 2021. The 2021 average teacher salary for Arkansas's school districts ranged from \$61,682 for Fayetteville School District to \$39,263 for Dermott School District. The district average teacher salary increased between 2017 and 2019, but declined slightly in 2020. It increased by 1.1% in 2021. See Appendix B for 2021 individual district average teacher salaries sorted from highest to lowest.

The following chart shows the gap between the highest and lowest average salaries for school districts between 2017 and 2021. The gap had been declining up until 2020 when it began to increase again.


# **School Districts Gap Between Highest and Lowest Average Salary**



#### Districts' School-Level Analysis

The graph below compares average salaries at the school level for public school districts. Average teacher salary levels are generally higher at schools within urban areas. Salary levels generally declined with higher levels of free and reduced lunch populations, and generally increased with higher concentrations of minority students. Salary levels generally grew at schools within increasingly larger districts, and Successful Schools had an average salary a little over \$400 higher than other schools' average salaries. Average salaries were higher in the Central and Northwest regions.



#### OPEN-ENROLLMENT PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL SYSTEMS' AVERAGE TEACHER SALARIES


The chart below provides the average salary amounts for open-enrollment public charter school systems between 2017 and 2021. The 2021 average salary for Arkansas's charter school systems range from \$52,732 for Haas Hall Academy to \$35,600 for Imboden Charter School District, which is a difference of \$17,132.

The following chart shows the gap between the highest and lowest average salaries for open-enrollment public charter school systems between 2017 and 2021. The gap declined in 2019, but increased in 2020 and 2021, but was still lower than it was in 2018 and 2017. 
# Charter School Systems Gap Between Highest and Lowest Average Salary



#### Charter School Systems' School-Level Analysis

The chart below compares average salaries at the school level within each of set of the BLR school categories for charter school systems. Average teacher salaries are generally higher at charter schools within rural areas and in the Northwest region. There were not clear patterns for free and reduced lunch, minority, or size categories. Successful Schools had an average salary that was \$2,800 higher than other schools' average salaries.

## Review of Minimum Teacher Salary Schedule

Arkansas does not mandate teacher salaries, but it does statutorily provide for a minimum teacher compensation schedule. <sup>10</sup> The following sections present information regarding the state's minimum teacher salary requirements and district-level minimum teacher salaries.

The Arkansas General Assembly enacted the Teacher Salary Enhancement Act<sup>11</sup> through the passage of Act 170 of 2019. The Teacher Salary Enhancement Act increased minimum teacher salary schedules for school years 2019-20 through 2022-23. The salary schedules establish minimum salaries for teachers based on years of experience (0-15 years) and on the type of degree earned by the teacher, with one schedule for bachelor-degree-prepared teachers and one for master-degree-prepared teachers. The table below provides the minimum salary schedule established for BA degree prepared and MA degree prepared teachers for 2021.

The minimum salary for 2020-21 for a bachelor degree prepared teacher with zero years of experience was raised to \$33,800, an increase of \$1,000. The minimum salary for a master degree prepared teacher with zero years of experience was also increased to \$38,450, also an increase of \$1,000. The minimum salary schedules enacted in Act 170 retain the \$450 increase for each succeeding year of experience through year 15 for bachelor-degree-prepared teachers and a \$500 increase for each additional year of experience for master-degree-prepared teachers. The following table shows the beginning salary rates (zero years of experience) enacted for each school year, 2019-20 (2020) through 2022-23 (2023).



In 2014, nine districts' minimum salaries were at the statutory minimum, but by 2015 the number at the minimum had decreased to five: Augusta, Deer/Mount Judea, Mineral Springs, Mulberry, and Nevada County. With the consistent rise of the state-mandated minimum salary beginning in 2016, the number of districts at the minimum salary began to rise, culminating with all 97 districts at the minimum salary of \$33,800 in 2021.

#### Minimum Teacher Compensation for BA Prepared Teachers 2014 to 2023



#### PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS' MINIMUM TEACHER SALARIES

The 2021 average minimum salary for school districts was \$35,799. The following chart provides the highest and lowest minimum salaries adopted by Arkansas school districts between 2017 and 2021. A full list of public school districts' minimum salaries can be found in Appendix D.

#### **District Minimum Teacher Salaries**



The following chart shows the difference or gap between the highest and lowest minimum salaries for school districts between 2017 and 2021. As the state mandated minimum salary has risen in recent years, the variance between the highest and lowest district-level minimum salary has declined. The gap was at its highest in 2015 (\$17,256).

# Gap Between Highest and Lowest Minimum Salary



Districts can and often do adopt individual district salary schedules that exceed the state-mandated minimum salary amounts. In 2021, 138 districts had minimum salaries higher than the state-mandated minimum, while 97 school districts adopted the state mandated minimum of \$33,800 (as their minimum salary).

A total of 28 districts paid a minimum salary of \$40,000 or more, with Springdale School District adopting the highest minimum salary of \$48,282. As shown in table below, the five districts paying the highest minimum salary are located within three counties. While Benton and Washington counties each have two of the highest paying minimum salary school districts in the state, disparities do exist among the starting minimum salaries paid by districts within the same counties. The difference between the highest and lowest minimum salary within Washington County is \$13,250 and \$12,950 in Benton County.

Out of the 67 Arkansas counties with more than one school district, 50 had school districts with varying minimum salaries. The table below shows the number of counties that include multiple school districts within the same county, grouped according to the dollar-amount difference between the highest and lowest minimum salaries for classroom teachers. A full list of Arkansas counties with differences between highest and lowest minimum salaries is provided in Appendix E.

#### OPEN-ENROLLMENT PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL SYSTEMS' MINIMUM TEACHER SALARIES

While 22 of the 23 open-enrollment public charter school systems operating in 2021 received a waiver from the minimum teacher compensation requirements found in A.C.A. § 6-17-2403, the charters did have minimum teacher salary amounts available for comparison. The 2021 average minimum salary for public charter school systems was \$37,037, which is about 3.5% higher than the average for school districts.

The following chart provides the highest and lowest minimum salaries adopted by Arkansas open-enrollment public charter school systems between 2017 and 2021. All but one (Exalt Academy of Southwest Little Rock) had a minimum salary above \$33,800. For the 2020-21 school year, the minimum salaries for teachers ranged from \$32,000 at Exalt Academy of Southwest Little Rock to \$48,000 for Haas Hall Academy. Eleven of the charter systems' minimum salary levels increased in 2021, with Haas Hall Academy having the greatest increase at almost 12%. 
### **Gap Between Highest and Lowest Minimum Salaries**



# **Average Salary Comparisons of Select Professions**

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) publishes Occupational Employment and Wage Estimates for major occupational groups in Arkansas and the United States. According to the BLS, these occupational employment and wage estimates "are calculated with data collected from employers in all industry sectors in metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas in every state and the District of Columbia." The following chart provides the Arkansas annual mean wage or salary for select occupations that require bachelor degree preparation.

## **2021 Legislation**

Act 679 (SB504) provides that, beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, school districts identified by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education as having an average annual teacher salary below the statewide target shall receive teacher salary equalization funding equal to one hundred eighty-five dollars (\$185) multiplied by the average daily membership of the school district for the previous school year. The act is identical to Act 680. The act declares an emergency and is effective on and after April 12, 2021.

Act 680 (HB1614) provides that, beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, school districts identified by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education as having an average annual teacher salary below the statewide target shall receive teacher salary equalization funding equal to one hundred eighty-five dollars (\$185) multiplied by the average daily membership of the school district for the previous school year. The act is identical to Act 679. The act declares an emergency and is effective on and after April 12, 2021.

## Appendix A – Average Teacher Salary Methodology

This report uses two data sources for comparing average teacher salaries: the NEA and Bureau of Legislative Research (BLR) Reports generated from Arkansas Public School Computer Network (APSCN) data maintained by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). The portion of the report that compares the average salary of the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) states as well as the states that surround Arkansas used the NEA data. When, however, this report compares the average salary of individual Arkansas school districts, the BLR reports are used. Both calculations are described below.

#### **National Education Association Average Teacher Salary Calculation**

According to instructions provided by the NEA to the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE), the average teacher salary is the arithmetic mean of the total amount regularly paid or stipulated to be paid to an individual before deductions for Social Security, health insurance, and the like. According to DESE, the amount of salary reported to NEA is based on what is actually paid, not "what is stipulated to be paid." It includes regular salaries for full-time and part-time employees considered to be in positions of a permanent nature, including substitutes, and does not include annual salaries for "extra pay for extra duty" or payments for teaching summer school (with the exception of 12-month employees). The salary and FTE amounts reported include the salaries paid for all elementary and secondary classroom teachers.

#### **Bureau of Legislative Research FTE and Average Teacher Salary Calculation**

The BLR has historically used the non-federal classroom teacher average salary from line 84 of the Annual Statistical Report (ASR) published by the DESE. The ASR calculation of the average non-federal classroom teacher salary is dependent upon the accuracy of data submitted by the districts to the State Information System (SIS) as part of the cycle reporting process. The basic program to calculate the average teacher salary used in the ASR was written by the Research and Technology Section of DESE using business logic developed by staff of the APSCN. The program allows districts to look at the calculation inputs and results and to make corrections if necessary. Corrections by the districts are particularly relevant when teachers work less than full-time or their time is charged less than full time to a particular budget unit.

Several years ago, the BLR developed a methodology to test the reasonableness of the calculated ASR non-federal classroom teacher average salaries using data available to the BLR from APSCN. A second important reason for the development of a Bureau methodology was to be able to produce a detailed listing by teacher of the FTE and salary amounts. Over that period of time, the BLR has consistently found 10 or more districts each year having significant differences between the Bureau calculation and the ADE calculation (using data reported and adjusted when necessary by the school districts). Generally, the problems have primarily concerned the FTE counts in smaller or medium-sized districts. While the effects can be very significant in these districts and can skew certain types of district level analysis, they have not caused a major distortion of statewide teacher salary averages.

The key features of the BLR's methodology are as follows:

 Details of actual salaries paid for each non-federal classroom teacher from the payroll distribution in APSCN are selected using the same parameters as used in the ASR.

- Matching records from the base salary record (initial budgeted) incorporating the planned percentage distribution between budget units (i.e. funding source or function) are compared to actual salaries.
- Adjustments to percentages are made based upon the relationships found between actual salaries paid and the base and annual salary (initial budgeted) of the base salary record to derive an FTE for each teacher.
- Base salary records were not found for approximately 2.5% of the total salaries. An FTE
  was calculated in these instances by dividing the actual salary paid by the statewide ASR
  median salary.
- The calculated average classroom teacher salaries for the 2021 school year and trend data for previous years presented in this report are based upon the program developed by the BLR using available data from APSCN. The BLR believes that using its own program to analyze APSCN data provides a more consistent method of deriving the FTE data and thereby results in a more reliable calculation of the average teacher salary.

#### **BLR Years of Experience and Degree Type Methodology**

As part of the analysis of Arkansas's districts' and charters' teacher salaries, the BLR calculated average years of years of experience and the percentage of classroom teachers with bachelor's and advanced degrees to further describe the attributes of teachers who are providing classroom instruction in Arkansas. The BLR chose to include only those teachers used in the calculation of average teacher salaries who were assigned classroom teacher responsibilities in APSCN.
