Our presence in Northwest Arkansas covers all UAMS mission areas: education, research, and clinical care.

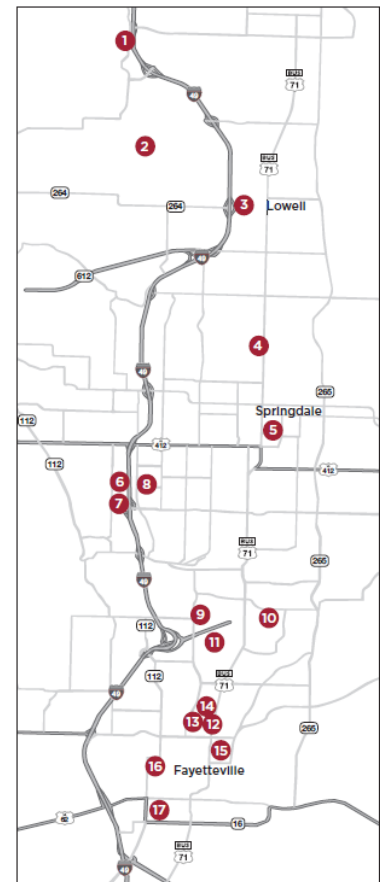
Fast Facts:

- 15 facilities currently in use, approximately half a million square feet
- Planned ortho/sports medicine surgical center will add another 115,000 square feet
- 500+ employees in the region

- Community-based faculty who provide hands on instruction to students in a clinical setting

Education in NWA:

- More than 350 students across all programs. UAMS Northwest academic programs are served by an Associate Provost, Regional Associate Deans, student support services, library, student health, and both UAMS and community-based clinical faculty.

Residency and Fellowship Training in NWA:

Current:

- 75 physician residents/fellows:
 - 29 Family medicine residents at UAMS Family Medical Centers, Washington Regional, Northwest Springdale.
 - 2 Family medicine rural training residents at Washington Regional, Mercy Hospital Berryville. The program began in 2023 and will have 12 residents when filled.
 - 33 Internal Medicine residents at Mercy Hospital Rogers, UAMS (internal medicine clinic and Butterfield Trail Village clinic) and Veterans Healthcare System of the Ozarks.
 - Year 1 8 Internal Medicine residents at Washington Regional. The program began in 2023 and will have 24 residents when program is filled.
 - 2 Sports Medicine fellows at UAMS (family medicine, orthopedics and sports medicine) and the University of Arkansas.
- 3 Pharmacy residents, based at UAMS Northwest and Walmart corporate

Office of Community Health and Research:

- 170+ employees
- \$25 million in extramural funding invested annually into community health initiatives, partnerships, and research in Arkansas
- Diabetes & Cardiometabolic Diseases – 1,000+ families impacted by Family Model Diabetes Self-Management Education. Programs available in Arkansas, Oklahoma, Washington, Hawaii, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands
- Maternal Child Health – Healthy Start, Fatherhood FIRE, and Centering Pregnancy
- Health Equity & Access
 - 230+ Community Health Workers trained, engaged, and deployed
 - 1,700+ mobile events completed in Arkansas
 - 5,000+ COVID and flu vaccines administered
 - Health Navigation – COVID-19, insurance and Medicaid assistance, general health education in English, Spanish, and Marshallese
- Health, Hunger & Nutrition – working with all six Arkansas food banks, 50+ community organizations, and 113 schools, reaching 75,000+ students
- Data, Evaluation & Dissemination – 200+ peer-reviewed academic journal articles published on this work

Noteworthy:

- Groundbreaking occurred in September of this year on a 115,000 square foot orthopedic and sports medicine surgery center in Springdale. Facility scheduled to open in 2025.
- Expansion of physician residency and fellowships to add new GME positions in the state.
- Expanded simulation education center and opportunities at UAMS Northwest and mobile for medical student, resident education and ongoing clinical staff training.
