

HUD COVID-19 CDBG Allocations to Arkansas



CDBG-CV1: \$10,814,424*CDBG-CV2: \$8,210,252

CDBG-CV3: \$7,363,278

Total Allocated: \$26,387,954

Round 1 allocation is limited to non-entitlement areas; entitlement cities (larger cities such as Little Rock) received their own CDBG allocation in Round 1. Rounds 2 and 3 are for state-wide needs.

Proposed Need-Based Allocation of CDBG-CV Funds






Public Services & Public Facilities - \$12,214,424



- Permitted uses must be specifically targeted to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19
- Examples: Improvement to health clinic facilities, homeless shelters, senior centers, etc.; expenses for testing supplies, PPE, education
- Method of Award: Competitive application process, which is same process used for annual general assistance awards
- · Applications will open in early 2021

Food Assistance - \$4,680,000





Funds will be awarded within next 60 days





Rental Assistance - \$5,760,000

- Available to households whose income is no more than 80% of area median income:
 - For a family of 4, the limit would be \$48,800 based on a state-wide average of income. (Actual limits will be based on area data.)
- Benefit Amount: Up to 2 months of actual rent, up to the fair market rental value, paid directly to landlord
- Funds will be awarded to 15 community action agencies and community development councils who will process applications and make disbursements; funds will be divided amongst agencies based on population.
- Consents will be secured from landlord to waive late fees and not pursue eviction.
- Funds awarded in next 60 days.
