The First Muster

The military organization we know today as the National Guard came into existence with the forming of the militia in the Massachusetts Bay colony in the early 17th century. On Dec. 13, 1636, a direct declaration established that all able-bodied men between the ages of 16 and 60 were required to join the militia.

The Arkansas militia was formed in 1804.

Arkansas Territory was created in 1819, with Arkansas formally becoming a state on June 15, 1836.

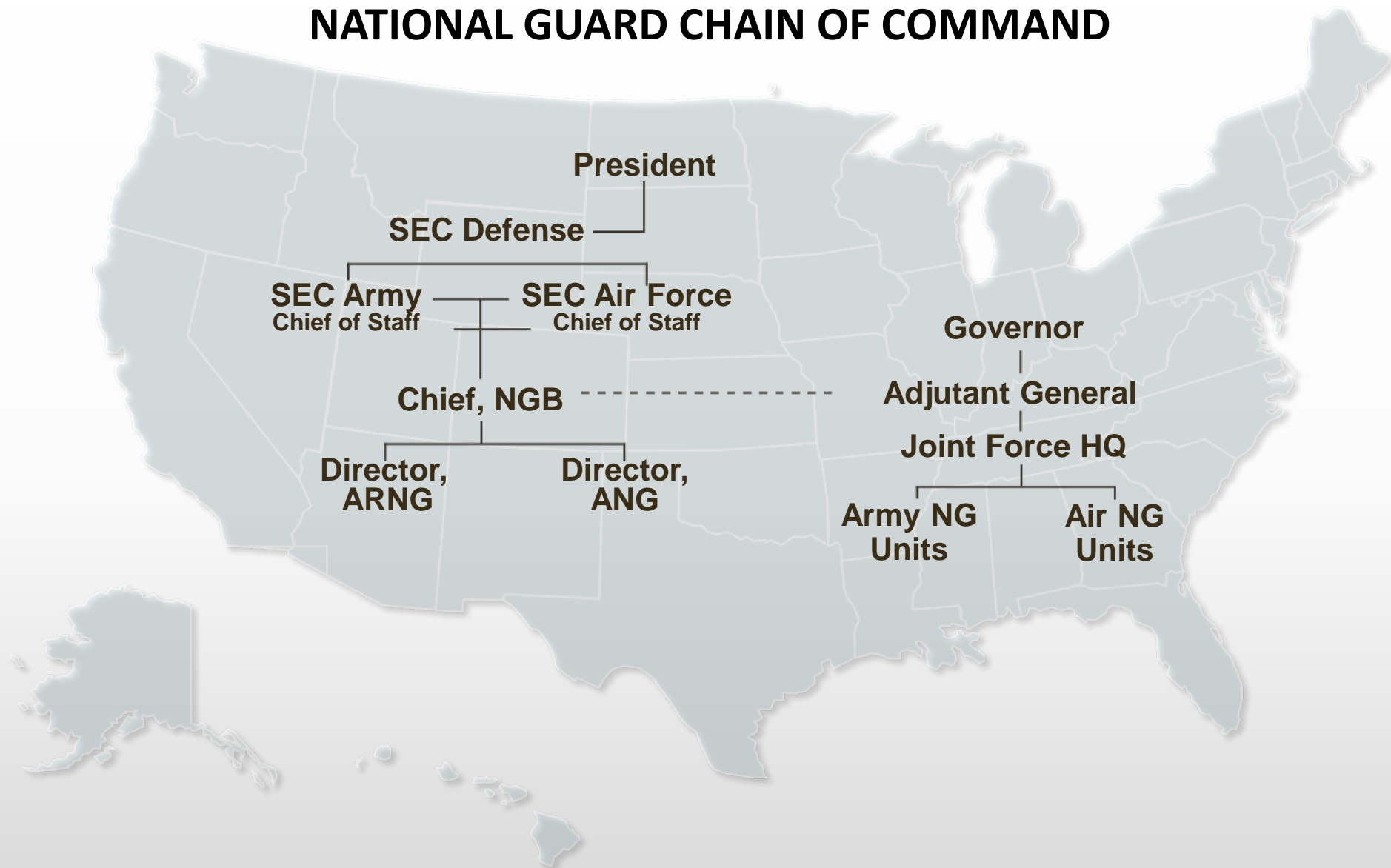
Your National Guard

The National Guard of the state, when not in the service of the United States, shall be governed and its affairs administered pursuant to law, by the governor, as commander-in-chief, through the adjutant general's department, of which the adjutant general shall be the executive head.

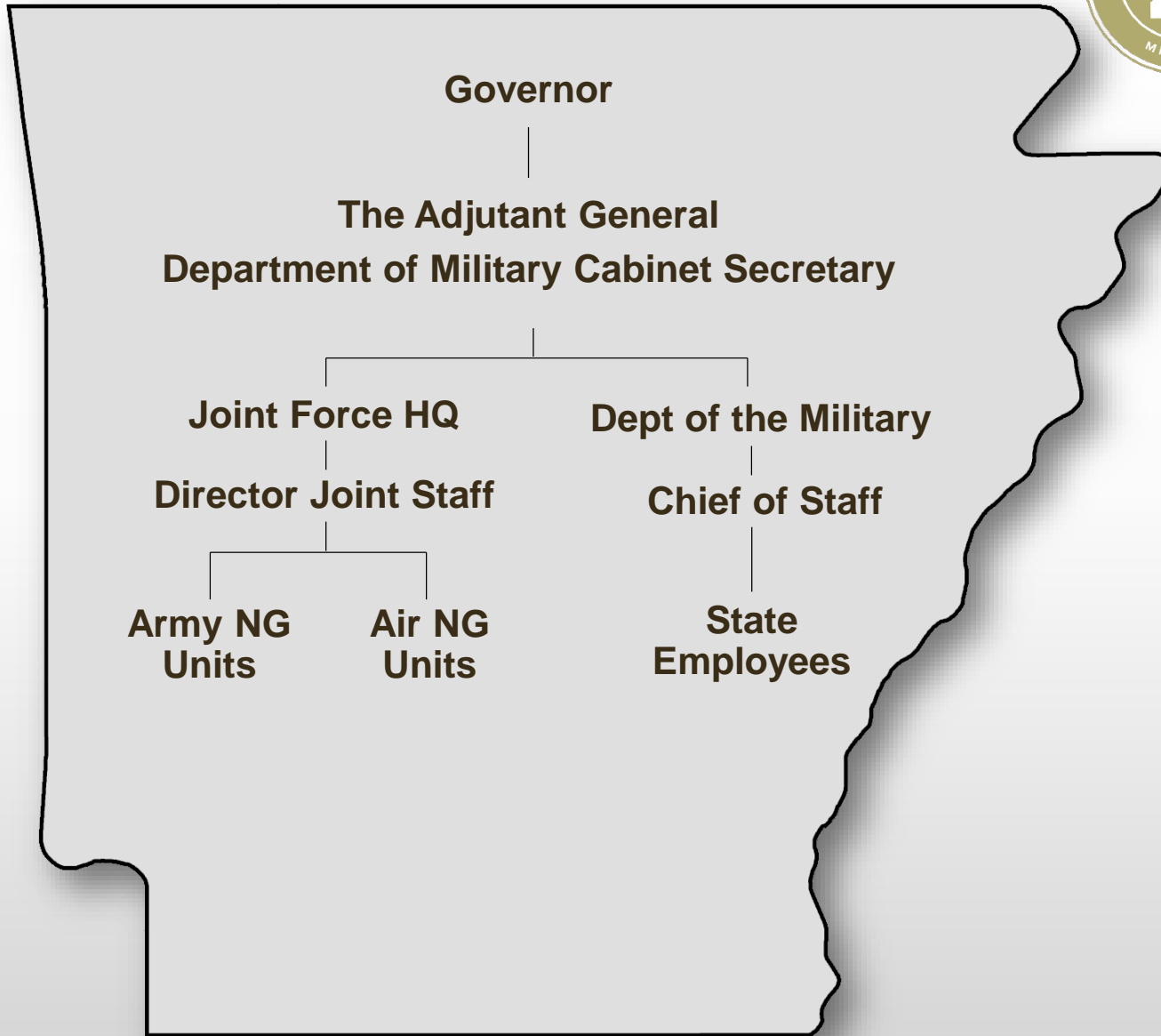

NATIONAL GUARD CHAIN OF COMMAND

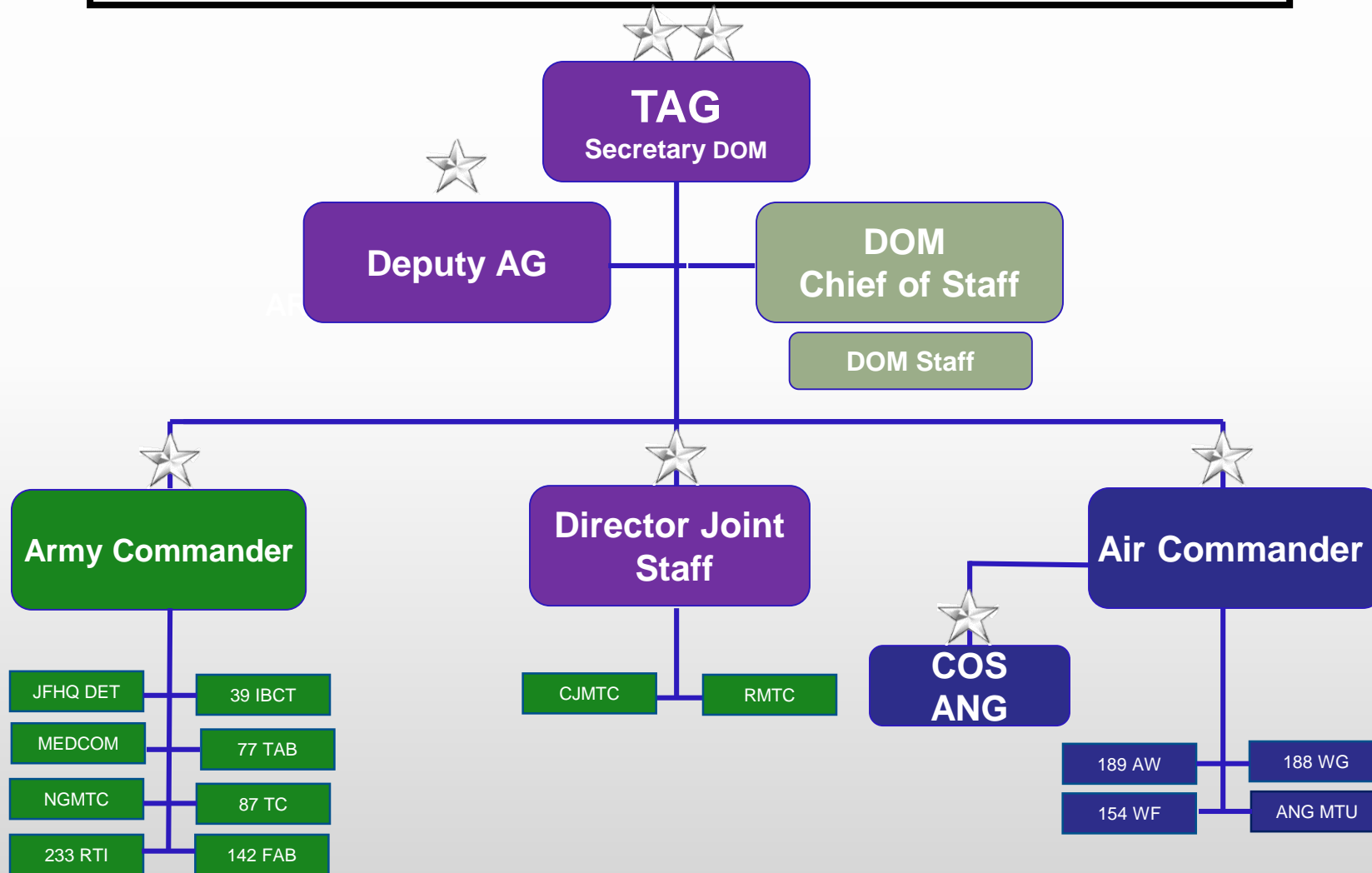




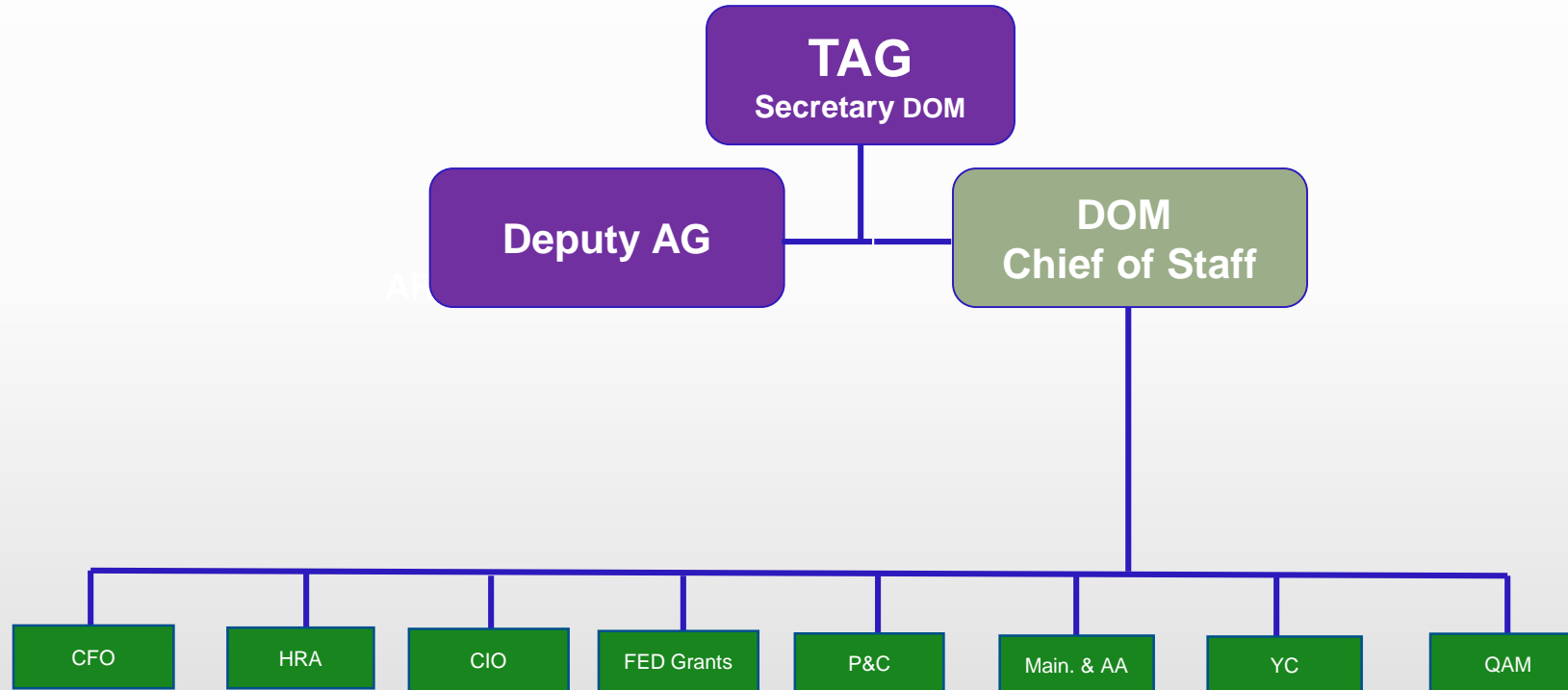

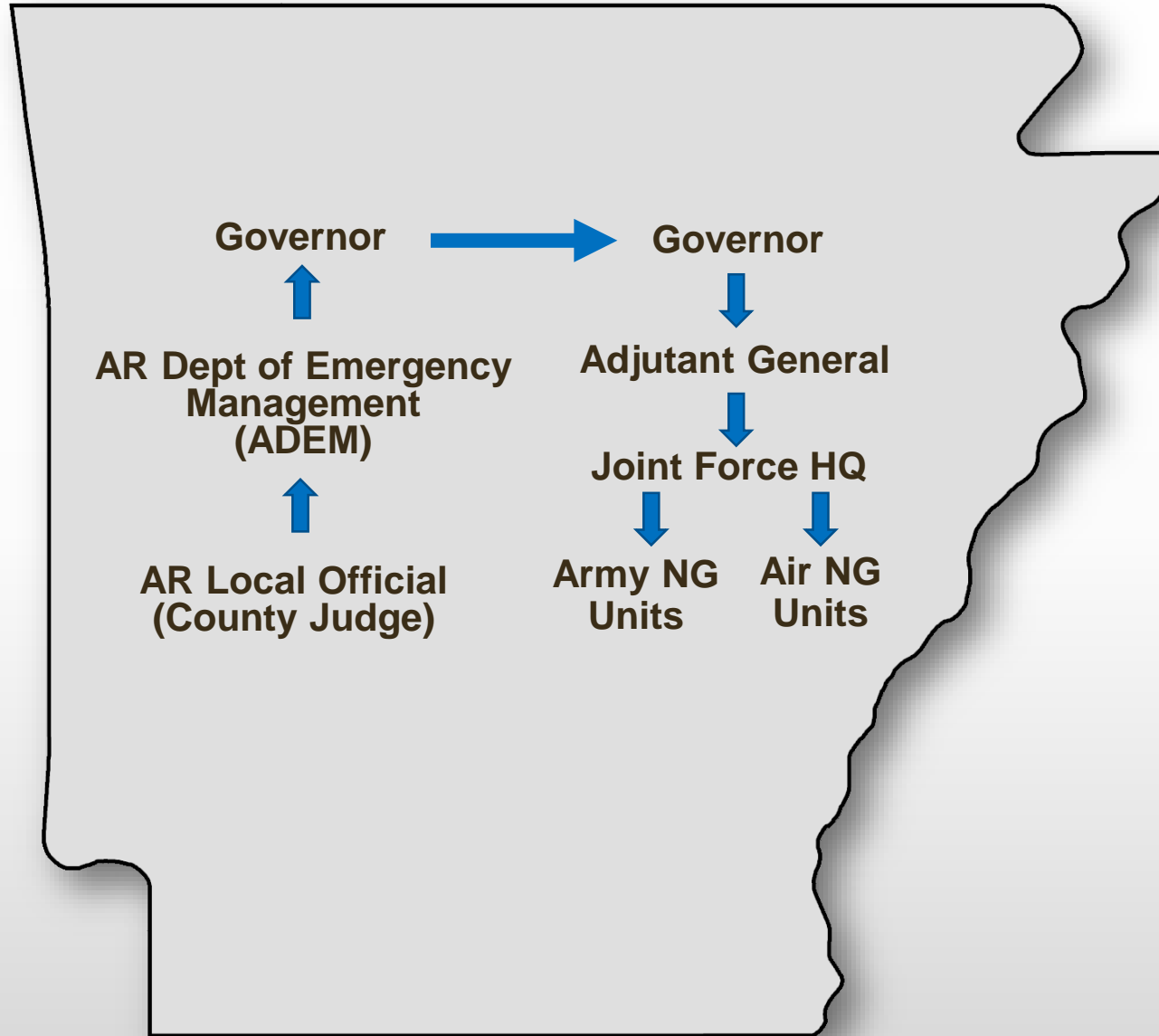
