ORDER OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION INCLUDING FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners (the 'Board') to determine whether the license issued to Travis Wyly, D.C. ("Respondent") to practice chiropractic medicine in the state of Arkansas should be summarily suspended pending formal hearing. The conference

On June 27, 2000, a summary hearing by telephone conference was held by the

commenced at 12:30 p.m.

Dr. Ralph Ungerank, acting Board President, called the meeting to order and conducted a roll call. All seven members of the Board were present by telephone. Present in the Board office and participating in the hearing were Carol Ann Gates, the Board's Executive Director, Ainsley H. Lang, Assistant Attorney General, representing the Board, and Gregory L. Crowe, hearing officer. A Notice of Hearing advising Dr. Wyly of the hearing was sent by mail to his current business address and by facsimile.

After hearing sworn testimony and reviewing documents received into evidence, the Board makes the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

F.1. At all times pertinent to this hearing Respondent was licensed as a chiropractor and practicing chiropractic in the state of Arkansas.

- F.2. On July 12, 1999, the Board convened in a special telephone conference meeting pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §17-81-204(2) to determine whether the Board should, on its own motion, initiate a complaint against the Respondent. The meeting was convened after the Board learned that Respondent had been arrested and charged with one count of First-Degree Sexual Abuse and four counts of Carnal Abuse. At this meeting, the Board voted unanimously to request a response to the charges from Respondent.
- F.3. On July 16, 1999, the Board received the response from Respondent. In his response, Respondent denied the allegations of Sexual Abuse and Carnal Abuse.
- F.4. On April 19, 2000, the Respondent entered a plea of guilty to four counts of Carnal Abuse, which is a Class D Felony, and one count of Sexual Abuse, which is a Class C Felony. These pleas were entered in Case Nos. CR99-2839 and CR99-3551 pending in the Fourth Division of Pulaski County Circuit Court.
- F.5. Certified copies of the Felony Information filed in CR99-2839 and CR99-3551 were attached to the Notice of Hearing as Exhibits 1 and 2.
- F.6. Certified copies of the Plea Statement filed in CR99-2839 and CR99-3551 were attached to the Notice of Hearing as Exhibits 3 and 4.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- C.1. The Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners has the duty and responsibility to regulate the profession of chiropractic and specifically the authority to discipline chiropractic physicians for violations of the Arkansas Chiropractic Act and/or the Rules and Regulations of the Board.
- C.2. Arkansas Code Ann. §25-15-211(c) and Board Rule B(2) provide that if the Board finds that the public health, safety or welfare imperatively requires emergency action,

and incorporates a finding to that effect in its order, summary suspension of a license may be ordered pending proceedings for revocation or other action, which proceedings shall be promptly instituted and determined. The allegations stated above support such a finding warranting emergency action.

## FINDING OF AN EMERGENCY

The Board hereby finds that allowing a doctor of chiropractic who has pled guilty to four counts of Carnal Abuse, a Class D Felony, and one count of Sexual Abuse, a Class C Felony, to continue to practice chiropractic constitutes an endangerment to the public health, safety and welfare which imperatively requires emergency action.

### **ORDER**

The Board hereby concludes and orders that the license issued to Travis Wyly, D.C. to practice chiropractic in the State of Arkansas is summarily suspended as of June 27, 2000. This summary suspension is ordered pending proceedings for revocation or other action that will be noticed to Respondent in accordance with the Arkansas Administrative Procedures Act.

## FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

On Tuesday, December 19, 2000, the Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners (the "Board") held a final hearing to determine whether the license issued to Travis Wyly, D.C. ("Respondent") to practice chiropractic in the State of Arkansas which was summarily suspended after a Summary Hearing by telephone conference should be placed on probation, suspended, revoked, and/or a civil penalty be imposed for alleged violation of the Arkansas Chiropractic Practices Act and the Rules and Regulations of the Board.

Respondent appeared personally. The case against Respondent was presented by

Assistant Attorney General, Ainsley H. Lang. Present for the hearing were Board President

Beverly Foster, D.C., and Board members, Michael Courtney, D.C., Larry Grinder, D.C., Robert

Shackleford, D.C., and Harold Gunter. Larry Crane served as hearing officer.

After reviewing documents received into evidence, hearing sworn testimony and hearing arguments of counsel and Respondent, the Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- F.1. At all times pertinent to this hearing, Respondent was licensed as a chiropractor and practicing chiropractic in the state of Arkansas.
- F.2. On July 12, 1999, the Board convened in a special telephone conference meeting pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §17-81-204(2) to determine whether the Board should, on its own

motion, initiate a complaint against the Respondent. The meeting was convened after the Board learned that Respondent had been arrested and charged with one count of First-Degree Sexual Abuse and four counts of Carnal Abuse. At this meeting, the Board voted unanimously to request a response to the charges from Respondent.

- F.3. On July 16, 1999, the Board received the response from Respondent. In his response, Respondent denied the allegations of Sexual Abuse and Carnal Abuse.
- F.4. On April 19, 2000, the Respondent entered a plea of guilty to four counts of Carnal Abuse, which is a Class D Felony, and one count of Sexual Abuse, which is a Class C Felony. These pleas were entered in Case Nos. CR99-2839 and CR99-3551 pending in the Fourth Division of Pulaski County Circuit Court.
- F.5. On June 27, 2000, the Board held a summary hearing by telephone conference to determine whether Respondent's license should be summarily suspended. After that hearing, the Board effected an emergency suspension of Respondent's license pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §25-15-211(c).
- F.6. On September 22, 2000, Respondent was sentenced to sixty (60) months at the Arkansas Department of Correction based upon his guilty pleas referenced in paragraph F.4. above, with twenty-four (24) months of the sentence to be suspended.
- F.7. Certified copies of the Felony Information filed in CR99-2839 and CR99-3551 were attached to the Notice of Final Hearing as Exhibits 1 and 2.
- F.8. Certified copies of the Plea Statement filed in CR99-2839 and CR99-3551 were attached to the Notice of Final Hearing as Exhibits 3 and 4.

F.9. Certified copies of the Departure Report, Conditions of Release on Probation and Information for Sex and Child Offender Registrants filed in CR99-2839 and CR99-3551 were attached to the Notice of Final Hearing as Collective Exhibits 5 and 6.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- C.1. The Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners has the duty and responsibility to regulate the profession of chiropractic and specifically the authority to discipline chiropractic physicians for violations of the Arkansas Chiropractic Act and/or the Rules and Regulations of the Board. The grounds upon which the Board may revoke or suspend a license, place a license on probation, and/or levy a civil penalty are set out in Ark. Code Ann.§17-81-313.
- C.2. Respondent's actions of pleading guilty to four counts of Carnal Abuse, a Class D Felony, and one count of Sexual Abuse, a Class C Felony, and being sentenced by the Court for these guilty pleas constitute violations of Ark. Code Ann. §17-81-313(a)(2), (3) and/or (6), in that Respondent:
  - (a)(2) Is guilty or crime or gross immorality;
  - (a)(3) Is unfit or incompetent by reason of negligence, habits or other causes; and/or
  - (a)(6) Is guilty of unprofessional conduct.
- C.3. Respondent's violations of Ark. Code Ann. §17-81-313(a)(2), (3) and/or (6) constitute grounds for the Board to levy a civil penalty of not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) nor less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each violation, or to place under probation, suspend, or revoke Respondent's license to practice chiropractic or to otherwise discipline Respondent.

#### **ORDER**

Based on the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law above, the Board hereby orders that Respondent's license to practice chiropractic in the State of Arkansas is suspended for five years beginning December 19, 2000. During this five-year period of suspension, Respondent shall not engage in the practice of chiropractic. At the conclusion of the five-year suspension, Respondent shall appear before the Board, in order for the Board to decide whether Respondent's license should be reinstated or revoked and whether the license, if reinstated, should be placed on probation for a period of time. At this time, Respondent may present evidence to the Board of treatment received during the time of suspension. In the event the Board does determine Respondent's license should be reinstated after the five-year period of suspension, the following conditions shall apply whether the license is reinstated with or without probation:

- 1. Respondent shall treat only adults in his practice.
- There shall be a second individual in the examining room with Respondent and his patient at all times.

This is a final order of the Board and, as such, it is subject to judicial review pursuant to the Arkansas Administrative Procedures Act, Ark. Code Ann. §25-15-201, et. seq. Any appeal of this final Order shall be filed within thirty days of Respondent's receipt of the Order.


The Power That Made the Body, Heals the Body
