



#### **Executive Summary**

For FY 2014 the age and gender of committed juvenile offenders remained overwhelmingly males between 15 and 17 years of age. In FY 2014 there was a 3% decrease in Caucasian youth and a 6% increase in African-American youth committed to DYS. In FY 2014 the number of youth recommitted to DYS in percentage points decreased 1% and the number of youth committed for felony type offenses increased by 2%. Starting mid October 2012, DYS started more accurately denoting the youth committed for revocation of probation, probation violations, and aftercare violations. The number of commitments to DYS from FY 2011 through FY 2014 averaged around 483 annually. In FY 2014 the number of commitments increased by 3.7% from the prior year.

Comparison of the Fiscal Years






Chart 3: Commitments by Offense\*

# Chart 5: Commitments by Race For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Period




Chart 6: Commitments by Race Comparison of the Fiscal Years




Chart 7: Commitments by Gender For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Period





Chart 8: Commitments by Gender Comparison of the Fiscal Years



# Chart 9: Commitments by Age For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Period




Chart 10: Offenses by Age
For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Quarter




Chart 11: Commitments by Age Comparison of the Fiscal Years




Chart 12: Number of Males Committed by Offense For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Period






Chart 13: Number of Females Committed by Offense For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Period




Chart 15: Total Population by Program Type




# Profiles of Juveniles Committed July 2013 - June 2014

Chart 21: Incidents Reports for FY 2014





Chart 22: Incidents Reported to Hotline for FY 2014
