
Executive Summary October – December, 2014

In the second quarter of FY2015, the number of juvenile offenders in state custody decreased from 763 reported in the previous quarter to 727 in the reporting quarter.

For youth committed during this quarter, basic demographic characteristics remain unchanged. The youth committed to custody are predominately male (89%). Over half of the youth (56%) were committed this quarter for misdemeanors or violation offenses. Over half (70%) were sixteen (16) years of age or older at the time of commitment.


In the second quarter, twenty-six (26) incidents of suspected abuse or neglect were referred to the Arkansas State Police. Of the twenty-six (26) incidents, the Arkansas State Police determined thirteen (13) merited an investigation. The status of all thirteen (13) investigations remain pending.

For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Quarter




Chart 4: Commitments by Gender
For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Quarter




Chart 5: Commitments by Age
For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Quarter




Chart 6: Offenses by Age
For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Quarter




Chart 7: Number of Males Committed by Offense For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Quarter




Chart 8: Number of Females Committed by Offense For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Quarter






Chart 9: Commitments by Person Crimes*

Chart 10: Violent* Vs. Non-Violent Offense Commitments For Juveniles Committed During Reporting Quarter






Chart 12: Commitments by Month







Chart 14a: DYS Custody Population by Race*






Chart 14b: DYS Custody Population by Age*







DYS IAU ensures that all appropriate incidents have been reported to the Child Abuse Hotline Unit of the Arkansas State Police (ASP). Upon reporting, the Hotline Unit determines whether the incident will be accepted for investigation. If accepted, the incident is then referred to the Investigation Unit of the ASP. The Investigation Unit of the (ASP) will then review the report and make a determination as to whether or not the information provided warrants a full investigation. If accepted for investigation by the Investigation Unit of the ASP, DYS IAU will be able to access the results of the investigation. If the incidents are not accepted for investigation by the Investigation Unit of the ASP, then DYS IAU still completes an internal investigation.


Additionally, delays in the receipt of information and lack of access to such information by the DYS IAU unit often occur. For instance, since DYS and its contractors are mandatory reporters, some of the incidents referred to the hotline may have occurred prior to DYS involvement in the youth's life. If so, given the confidentiality restrictions, DYS is not entitled to the final results of the investigation as they were not a party to the incident. Further, due to the length of the investigation period, it is likely that incidents reported by DYS and accepted by the Investigation Unit of ASP will not be finalized nor their results shared during the current quarter.

Units by Program Designation




Chart 22: Community Based Services Number of Youth Served by Case Type*
