# **AGRICULTURE**

Rice – Arkansas is the nation's No. 1 rice producer, and the Division of Agriculture breeds and tests rice and production techniques to keep the state at the top.

**Soybeans** — Arkansas ranks No. 11 in soybeans and the Division is among the leaders in variety testing and non-GMO soybean breeding.

Livestock — Arkansas is No. 3 in catfish and 23 in cattle/calf production. Our research is helping reduce feed inputs to keep producers in business.

POUltry — Arkansas is No. 2 in broiler production. The Division's Center of Excellence for Poultry Science provides the nation's premiere research, extension and academic poultry science programs.

### Fruits & Vegetables -

Consumers love our university-bred blackberries, grapes and peaches, which also promote producer profitability. Spinach, peas, tomatoes and turnips from Division of Agriculture breeding programs have places in national markets.

Diagnostic Labs - The Division

provides diagnostic and analytical services for animal and plant health, soil fertility, nematodes, and poultry and cattle nutrition and genetics.

Master Gardeners – Nearly 3,000 Arkansans reported more than 79,000 learning hours and gave more than 119,000 volunteer service hours to their communities through the Master Gardener program.
