



### Revenue Stabilization Act for 2017 Act 270 of 2016

- The Revenue Stabilization Law provides for the distribution of general revenue to State Agencies and Institutions of Higher Education. The Revenue Stabilization Law for FY2017 first distributes general revenue to allocations in Category "A" in an amount that totals \$5.205 million dollars. This includes an allocation of \$13.8 million dollars for the Rainy Day set aside to address unforeseen needs and provide funding for educational facilities.
- With one exception Category "A" provides funding to each allocation at a level that will continue existing services which is commonly referred to as base level. The Department of Human Services Children and Family Services Division allocation in Category "A" includes an increase of \$20.4 million dollars for additional foster care workers, associate foster care cost and to provide supplemental general revenue funding for a reduction in federal funding.
- Category "B" has a total allocation of \$127.9 million dollars for the following purposes:
  - The Department of Education Public School Fund allocation is \$23.7 million dollars for kindergarten through twelfth grade (K-12) funding at the level recommended by the Joint Adequacy Evaluation Oversight Subcommittee.
  - The DHS Grants or Medicaid funding allocation of \$88 million dollars provides for the estimated growth in traditional Medicaid and federal matching requirements of the Arkansas Works program.
  - The DHS Behavioral Health Services allocation of \$3.5 million dollars is for overall behavioral health reform and to take advantage of federal matching funds that have become available.
  - The Department of Higher Education Grants allocation of \$2 million dollars is to supplement Workforce Initiative Grants.
  - The Department of Economic Development allocation of \$1.5 million dollars is for enhanced economic development marketing and to open an office in Germany.
  - The Department of Correction allocation of \$4 million dollars will replace one-time general improvement funding award in fiscal year 2016 and for the Bowie County Detention Facility.
  - The Merit Adjustment Fund allocation of \$5.2 million dollars will provide funding for fiscal year 2017 to pay for the ongoing cost of a 1% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) awarded to state employees in Fiscal Year 2016.
- Section 5 of Act 270 provides a fund transfer from surplus to the Rainy Day fund for \$50 million dollars.
- Section 6 of Act 270 provides a fund transfer from the Attorney General from cash settlement funds to the Department of Veterans' Affairs of \$2.27 million dollars to supplement construction cost at the North Little Rock Veterans' Home facility.

#### 2016 THIRD EXTRAORDINARY SESSION FISCAL RELATED ACTS

### STATE AGENCIES, BOARDS, AND COMMISSIONS

### Act 2 (SB10)

• Transfer, Elimination, and Sunset of Certain Entities. ACT 2 (SB10) and ACT 3 (HB1006) are identical acts that make various amendments to Arkansas law that promote efficiency and effectiveness in the operations of state government, including transferring the Arkansas History Commission to the Department of Arkansas Heritage, repealing certain governmental entities such as the Building Authority Council, and amending the membership, tenure, and duties of certain agencies, task forces, committees, and commissions. The acts declare an emergency and became effective on May 23, 2016. The sections concerning the transfer of the Arkansas History Commission become effective on July 1, 2016.

### **WORKERS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION**

Act 4 (HB1010)

• Act 4 and 5 end payments from the Death and Permanent Total Disability Trust Fund for claims for death or permanent total disability benefits that are filed on and after June 30, 2019. The act lowers the employers' tax under the Workers' Compensation Law to not more than one and five-tenths percent (1.5%) after the final payment is made through the Death and Permanent Total Disability Trust Fund.

### **HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION**

#### Act 1 (HB1009)

Funding and State Highway Commission Reporting. ACT 1 (HB1009) creates the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund to provide for additional funding for the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department; transfers forty million dollars (\$40,000,000) from the General Improvement Fund to the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund; eliminates the State Central Services deduction for the temporary one-half-cent sales tax; allocates twenty-five percent (25%) of general revenues remaining after making the maximum annual allocation to the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund; redirects four million dollars (\$4,000,000) of diesel tax from general revenue to the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department Fund; and creates the Highway Commission Review and Advisory Subcommittee of the Legislative Council to review and publish proposed rules of the State Highway Commission regarding the distribution of highway funds and the spending priority designated for highway construction contracts and public road construction projects. The act also requires the State Highway Commission to provide the Highway Commission Review and Advisory Subcommittee of the Legislative Council with a report on the progress of each public road construction project of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) or more. Sections 9-12, 14, 16 and 17 of the act become effective July 1, 2017. The act declares an emergency, and Sections 1-8, 13, 15 and 18-21 become effective on July 1, 2016.
