#### **EDUCATION - GENERAL**

#### DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

#### Appropriation

ACT 5 (HB1003) provides an appropriation for forty-three million dollars (\$43,000,000) and funding with a fund transfer from unobligated funds in the General Improvement Fund to the Department of Education Public School Fund Account for additional public school employee health insurance for the 2014 plan year. The additional forty-three million dollars (\$43,000,000) is estimated to reduce the increase in the 2014 plan year to an approximate ten percent (10%) rate increase when compared to the 2013 plan year. The act declares an emergency and is effective on and after October 21, 2013.

#### SCHOOL DISTRICTS - FINANCE

#### Facilities

ACT 1 (SB4) provides for savings from the phase out of state financial assistance from general facilities funding and supplemental millage incentive funding to be distributed to the Employee Benefits Division of the Department of Finance and Administration for the exclusive benefit of public school employees participating in the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Program. The act declares an emergency and is effective on and after July 1, 2014.

#### TEACHERS - GENERALLY

#### Professional Development

ACT 2 (SB5) aligns professional development requirements with the requirements set by the Department of Education and sets the amount of funding for professional development up to thirty-two dollars and forty cents (\$32.40). The act declares an emergency and is effective on and after July 1, 2014.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL LAW**

#### WATER POLLUTION AND CONTROL

#### Water Quality Standards

ACT 4 (HB1002) repeals Act 954 of 2013, which required the Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology Commission to follow certain procedures and consider certain criteria in promulgating water quality standards for minerals. The act does not contain an emergency clause and is effective on the ninety-first day following the date the General Assembly adjourns sine die.

#### **INSURANCE**

#### HEALTH INSURANCE

#### State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Program

ACT 3 (SB6) and Act 6 (HB1011) are identical acts that (1) dissolve the current membership of the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Board on November 20, 2013; (2) require a new board membership to be seated on December 1, 2013; (3) clarify the duties and responsibilities of the board; (4) add two (2) additional members to the board; (5) prohibit the board from offering health insurance plan options that do not have a deductible; (6) direct school districts to spend all funding allocated for public school employee health insurance through the matrix per-student funding calculation for public school employee health insurance; (7) allow school districts to make employer contributions into an employee's health savings account; (8) require the board, as well as health savings account vendors, to provide education and guidance to state employees, state employee retirees, public school employees, and public school employee retirees on the health insurance plan options available, including the advantages and disadvantages of each plan; (9) establish the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Program Legislative Task Force to study and recommend changes to the program, including to the governance structure and general operation; and (10) require the task force to submit a preliminary report to the legislature on or before June 30, 2014, and a final report on or before June 29, 2015. The task force expires on June 30, 2015. The act declares an emergency and is effective on and after October 21, 2013.
