31	(a) The Arkansas	S State Board of Nursing may gra	nt a certificate of

35	preceptorial experience in the prescription of drugs, medicines, and

2	(A) Has a collaborative practice agreement with a		
3	practicing physician who is licensed under the Arkansas Medical Practices

5	who has training in scope, specialty, or expertise to that of the advanced		
6	practice registered nurse on file with the Arkansas State Board of Nursing;		
7	(B) Completes at least two thousand (2,000) hours approved

9	(i) A physician; or		
10	(ii) An advanced practice registered nurse who has

- 17 shall include protocols for prescriptive authority;
- 18 (3) Coverage of the healthcare needs of a patient in the
- 19 emergency absence of the advanced practice registered nurse or collaborating
- 20 physician or collaborating advanced practice registered nurse; and
- 21 (4) Quality assurance.
- 22 (d) If a collaborative practice results in complaints of violations of
- 23 the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, § 17-95-201 et seq., § 17-95-301 et seq.,
- 24 and § 17-95-401 et seq., the Arkansas State Medical Board may review the role
- 25 of the physician in the collaborative practice to determine if the physician
- 26 is unable to manage his or her responsibilities under the agreement without
- 27 an adverse effect on the quality of care of the patient.
- 28 (e) If a collaborative practice results in complaints of violations of
- 29 this chapter, the Arkansas State Board of Nursing may review the role of the
- 30 advanced practice registered nurse in the collaborative practice to determine
- 31 if the nurse is unable to manage his or her responsibilities under the
- 32 agreement without an adverse effect on the quality of care of the patient.
