- 29 INNOVATION AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND TRANSFERS. The Department of
- 30 Transformation & Shared Services Division of Information Systems is a cost
- 31 recovery agency subject to the requirements of the United States Office of
- 32 Management and Budget Circular A-87 Cost Principles for State, Local and

17	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in		
18	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the		
19	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2024 could work irreparable harm		
20	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental		
21	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act		
22	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health		
23	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2024.		
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
