NSLA Flexibility

A.C.A. §6-20-2305(b)(4)(C)(ii)

- Districts may use NSLA categorical funds to supplement classroom teachers' salaries under following conditions:
 - Cannot use carry forward or reserve NSLA funds to supplement salaries
 - Must meet Minimum teacher salary schedule without using NSLA funds
 - Must comply with Standards of Accreditation and Fiscal Assessment and Accountability program without using NSLA funds
 - Must include NSLA flexibility actions in the ACSIP Plan

Types of NSLA Flexibility

- · Supplement classroom salaries above the minimum
- Bonus

Supplement Classroom Salaries Above the Minimum

- Must have used NSLA funds for this purpose in 2006-2007
- · Must meet state minimum salary schedule
- Must reduce amount of NSLA funds used to supplement salaries by 20% until no more than 20% of the total annual NSLA allotment is used to supplement classroom teachers' salaries above the minimum
- Must not use NSLA reserves or carryover to supplement salaries
- Must comply with the standards of accreditation without using NSLA funds
- Must include supplemental classroom teachers' salaries in ACSIP Plan

NSLA Bonuses for Classroom Teachers

- · Must not use NSLA carryover or reserves for the bonus
- Must meet state minimum salary schedule without using NSLA funds
- Must meet Standards Accreditation and Fiscal Accountability program without using NSLA funds
- · Must include bonus activities in ACSIP Plan
- Must have met the academic needs of the students in the district
- · Must be a non-recurring bonus to a classroom teacher's salary

NSLA Bonuses for Classroom Teachers (Continued)

- Must list district employees to receive the bonus and the amount of the bonus
- · Must provide student-to-teacher ratio

Written report of activities due June 15, 2008

NSLA Flexibility Deadline

Districts had until March 31, 2008 to request NSLA flexibility and to amend their ACSIP Plans

Commissioner's Review

- · Have the academic needs of students been met?
- · Has the district prudently used resources?
- · Has the district met Standards without using NSLA funds?
- Has the district included NSLA flexibility in ACSIP?
