Miller 4 5 6 For An Act To Be Entitled 7 "AN ACT TO AMEND THE ARKANSAS ANATOMICAL GIFT ACT TO 8 PRESCRIBE THE DUTIES OF COUNTY CORONERS AND TRANSPLANT 9 PROCUREMENT AGENCIES CONCERNING THE PROCUREMENT OF 10 11 TRANSPLANTABLE TISSUE FROM DONORS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES." 12 13 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 15 16 SECTION 1. Title 20, Chapter 17, Subchapter 6 of the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated is hereby amended by adding a new section to read as follows: 17 "20-17-614. (a) The coroners of the counties of Arkansas shall 18 19 facilitate procurement of transplantable tissue in the following ways: 20 (1) by notifying the appropriate procurement agency of all 21 potential donors; 22 (2) by providing necessary medical and next-of-kin consent 23 information which shall be kept confidential; by assuring that next-of-kin consent is obtained in 24 (3) 25 accordance with the priority established in Ark. Code Ann. §20-17-603. 26 Consent shall be obtained in a sensitive manner and witnessed or recorded, if 27 obtained by telephone. A copy of the coroner's consent form shall be kept 28 with all records. The form shall include the name of the decedent, the person 29 making the request and the person giving permission, as well as the date and 30 time, the tissue requested and its purpose and the agency to whom it was 31 released; (4) by sharing necessary statistics so that the potential in that 32 33 jurisdiction may be determined; and (5) by ensuring that the procurement will not interfere with any 34 35 investigations. 36 (b) Any coroner who follows the provisions of this act or attempts in

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1 good faith to do so shall not be liable in any civil or criminal action. (c) Any procurement organization which procures transplantable tissue 2 3 from a person declared dead outside of a hospital by the coroner shall assist 4 that coroner in the following manner: (1) determining suitability of the donation for transplant or 5 6 research, as applicable; 7 (2) assuming responsibility for the direct costs of the 8 procurement; however, under no circumstances shall compensation be paid for 9 the referral itself; (3) providing a report of any observations and gathering of 10 11 information and specimen as directed by the coroner or medical examiner; (4) providing twenty-four (24) hour availability for receiving 12 13 referrals; and 14 (5) providing education and information in all matters related to 15 transplant as desired. 16 (d) All tissue procured in Arkansas shall be offered first to Arkansas 17 patients before consideration of out-of-state patients." 18 19 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 20 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 21 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 22 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 23 24 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 25 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 26 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 27 act are declared to be severable. 28 SECTION 4.
