**For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND  
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES -  
10 DIVISION OF ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE PREVENTION FOR THE  
11 BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1993; AND FOR OTHER  
12 PURPOSES."

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

16 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the  
17 Department of Human Services - Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention  
18 for the 1991-93 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees  
19 whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform  
20 Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its  
21 successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any  
22 position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in  
23 dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification  
24 and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are  
25 hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and  
26 Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

 16 appropriated, to the Department of Human Services - Division of Alcohol and  
 17 Drug Abuse Prevention, to be payable from the federal funds as designated by  
 18 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for personal services and operating  
 19 expenses of the Department of Human Services - Division of Alcohol and Drug  
 20 Abuse Prevention for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the following:

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SECTION 5. EXTRA HELP - FEDERAL. There is hereby authorized, for the Department of Human Services - Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention for the 1991-93 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: one (1) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATIONS - BENTON DETOXIFICATION SERVICES CENTER. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Human Services - Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention, to be payable from the Alcohol and Drug Safety Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Department of Human Services - Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention - Benton Detoxification ~~Services Center for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the following:~~

SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and

1 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
2 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control  
3 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the  
4 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be  
5 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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7 SECTION 8. ALCOHOL/DRUG TREATMENT PILOT PROGRAM. *It is the specific*  
8 *intent of the General Assembly that the general revenue funds appropriated in*  
9 *Section 2, Item (08) of this Act be used to develop and support a pilot*  
10 *demonstration project designed to establish a comprehensive and integrated*  
11 *system for residential, inpatient, and alcohol/drug treatment services to*  
12 *individuals demonstrating primary problems of substance abuse. The Department*  
13 *of Human Services-Office of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention shall be*  
14 *authorized to utilize appropriated funds to purchase these services through*  
15 *accredited providers of inpatient, residential and other alcohol/drug*  
16 *treatment services, as approved by the Department of Human Services - Office*  
17 *of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention for use in the project area which shall*  
18 *consist of the counties of Ashley, Bradley, Chicot, Desha, and Drew.*

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20 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
21 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
22 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which  
23 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
24 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
25 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
26 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
27 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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29 SECTION 10. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and  
30 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and  
31 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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33 SECTION 11. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the  
34 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such  
35 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which

1 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this  
2 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

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4 SECTION 12. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict  
5 with this Act are hereby repealed.

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7 SECTION 13. HEALTH PREMIUMS. The Department of Human Services -  
8 Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention shall not, during the 1992-93  
9 fiscal year, spend more for health insurance per employee than the amount  
10 being contributed to the State Employees Health Insurance Program.

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12 SECTION 14. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by  
13 the Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of  
14 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year  
15 period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the  
16 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided,  
17 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the  
18 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm  
19 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
20 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
21 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
22 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
