For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES -
10 DIVISION OF DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES SERVICES FOR THE
11 BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1993; AND FOR OTHER
12 PURPOSES."

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

15
16 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the
17 Department of Human Services - Division of Developmental Disabilities Services
18 for the 1991-93 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees
19 whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform
20 Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its
21 successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any
22 position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in
23 dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification
24 and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are
25 hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and
26 Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

22 SECTION 12. SPECIAL AUTHORIZATION - CASH FUNDS. All funds received by

23 the Division of Developmental Disabilities Services of the Department of Human

24 Services shall be placed in the State Treasury and expended via appropriation.

25 Those funds held in trust by the agency for the residents of the Human

26 Development Centers, including Gifts and Bequests, shall be considered agency

27 funds to be expended from bank accounts without legislative appropriation.

28 The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall have the final authority to

29 determine those funds which may be exempted from being placed in the State

30 Treasury unless otherwise provided by law. Provided, however, no agency funds

31 deposited in bank accounts shall be expended for purposes other than those

32 allowed for the expenditures of State Treasury funds under the provisions of

33 the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law of Arkansas.

34

35 SECTION 13. VOCATIONAL TRAINEES. The Division of Developmental

1 Disabilities Services of the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized
2 for the 1991-93 biennium to provide employment opportunities for people with
3 disabilities residing at the Human Development Centers who work less than a
4 competitive employment level separate from the currently authorized regular
5 Vocational Trainee positions. The positions authorized herein shall not be
6 incorporated into the present classification system but shall be provided for
7 by each Human Development Center on a Cash Account basis. It is the intent of
8 the General Assembly that the authorization of these positions shall
9 facilitate the agency's ability to provide for residents with lower work
10 productivity.

11

12 SECTION 14. TRANSFER OF FUNDS. The Director of the Department of Human
13 Services is hereby authorized, with the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer
14 of the State, and after having sought a prior review by the Arkansas
15 Legislative Council, to transfer any line item appropriation to any other line
16 item appropriation authorized herein with one exception: Item (01) of Section
17 9 herein, the same being Grants-in-Aid may not be decreased.

18

19 SECTION 15. COMMUNITY PROGRAM MATCHING. Nothing in this Act shall
20 prevent use of funds allocated under the Grants-in-Aid Appropriation to match
21 Title XIX or Social Services Block Grant (Title XX) funds to be used by
22 private non-profit community based services. Developmental Disabilities
23 Services (DDS) shall continue to allocated to private non-profit community
24 based services a total percentage of Social Services Block Grant (Title XX)
25 funds received that is equal to or greater than the percentage of Social
26 Services Block Grant (Title XX) funds received by DDS and allocated to
27 community based programs for Fiscal Year 1982-83.

28

29 SECTION 16. APPLICATIONS FOR SERVICES. In the event that existing
30 services now funded from the Grants-In-Aid Appropriation, being item (01) of
31 Section 9 herein, are extended to unserved areas of the state, or in the event
32 that new services are made available, to be funded from the Grants-In-Aid
33 Appropriation, existing private community based service providers shall be
34 granted an opportunity to make application to expand their service base to
35 unserved areas or shall be granted an opportunity to make application to offer

1 new services in their existing service area. In areas in which the Division
2 of Developmental Disabilities Services determines that new or expanded
3 services are to be offered, it shall provide notice of its intent to provide
4 the services to existing providers in the area and to the general public.
5 Before licensing new service providers in an area, the Division shall
6 determine in writing that existing service providers are not qualified or are
7 unable or unwilling to extend services to new areas or provide new services.
8 Nothing in this Act shall restrict the Division's discretion to award new or
9 expanded services to the existing community based service providers making
10 application for the same pursuant to this section. The intent of this section
11 is to avoid unnecessary duplication of costs and services in the extension or
12 expansion of services.

13

14 SECTION 17. DHS/DDS-ICF MATCHING. Medicaid matching funds for the 15
15 bed or less Intermediate Care Facility for the Mentally Retarded program shall
16 not be paid from the Grants-in-Aid Appropriation, being item (01) of Section 9
17 herein.

18

19 SECTION 18. COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES. Funds allocated under the
20 Grants-in-Aid appropriation, being item (01) of Section 9 herein, shall be
21 used only to provide services through private community based services
22 licensed or certified by the Arkansas Division of Developmental Disabilities.
23 When DDS licensed providers are involved in delivering services which are
24 Medicaid reimbursable, they must enroll as a provider with the Arkansas
25 Medicaid Program and must bill the Arkansas Medicaid Program for all covered
26 services for eligible individuals.

27 Services which are covered by the Arkansas State Medicaid Program or
28 under the Alternative Community Service Waiver Program (ASC) will be utilized
29 to the maximum extent possible for any individual who is eligible for Medicaid
30 coverage prior to any expenditure of general revenue, other than for Medicaid
31 matching funds, or Title XX. It is the intent of this section that DDS, as a
32 general policy, maximize the use of Medicaid funding available for services.
33 The State shall require each provider funded from the Grant-in-Aid
34 appropriation or from the Grants/Patient Service Line, being item (07) of
35 Section 3 herein, to screen each individual to whom services are provided for

1 a determination of eligibility or ineligibility for Medicaid coverage within
2 thirty days of the first date that services are provided. It is the intent of
3 this section to insure that whenever possible, Medicaid funds are utilized for
4 covered or waived services to individuals who are eligible for coverage
5 under the Arkansas Medicaid Program or the ASC Waiver.

6 Nothing in this Act shall prevent the Division or any provider from
7 extending emergency services in a timely manner.

8

9 SECTION 19. DHS/DDS-REVIEW OF RATES. The Division of Developmental
10 Disabilities Services, in coordination with the Division of Developmental
11 Disabilities Funding Committee and representatives from parent/consumer
12 organizations, will review the rates for services paid from the Grant-In-Aid
13 Appropriation and will make recommendations concerning changes in those rates.
14 This group will recommend uses for any increased state funds made available
15 by increased utilization of Medicaid funds for existing services now paid for
16 by state funds from the Grant-In-Aid Appropriation.

17

18 SECTION 20. CARRY FORWARD. The unexpended balances in appropriations
19 for the expenditure of Federal Funds as provided for in this Act shall, at the
20 end of each fiscal year, be carried forward and made available for
21 expenditures for the same purpose for the next fiscal year.

22

23 SECTION 21. GRANTS IN AID-CONDITIONS FOR RECEIVING FUNDS. Private
24 nonprofit community based programs licensed by the Department of Human
25 Services, Developmental Disabilities Services, are eligible to receive funds
26 appropriated in Section 9 of this Act, and as a condition of receiving such
27 funds they shall:

28 1. Meet minimum standards of performance in the delivery of services to
29 people with disabilities as defined by the Department of Human Services,
30 Developmental Disabilities Services.

31 2. Supply statistical and financial data to the Department of Human
32 Services, Developmental Disabilities Services.

33 3. Establish and maintain a sound financial management system in accordance
34 with guidelines as set forth by the Department of Human Services.

35 4. Establish and maintain community support programs designed to provide

1 coordinated care and treatment to ensure ongoing involvement and
2 individualized services for persons with disabilities. Every community
3 support program shall provide services for persons with disabilities who
4 reside within the respective area of the program. At a minimum, each
5 community support program shall provide assessment, diagnosis, identification
6 of persons in need of services, case management, crisis intervention,
7 supervision, counseling and activities of daily living.

8 5. The Board of Directors of each Center licensed by the Department of
9 Human Services, Developmental Disabilities Services shall adopt and have on
10 file an annual plan for the delivery of community support services for persons
11 with disabilities. Each Center's plan review shall become a part of the
12 licensure process.

13

14 SECTION 22. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized for the
15 Department of Human Services - Developmental Disabilities Services Division
16 for the 1991-93 biennium, the following maximum number of employees to be
17 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such
18 purposes: Fifty-one (51) employees, when needed at rates of pay not to exceed
19 those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its
20 successor, for the appropriate classification. Any of these positions
21 utilized in a manner which is reimbursable under Title XIX is specifically
22 exempt from limitation of hours, either by Act or Regulation.

23

24 SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated for Grants-in-Aid in Section 9
25 hereof \$414,562 is hereby designated to fund residential services for persons
26 with developmental disabilities in HUD constructed apartments and homes. The
27 following programs will be funded up to the following amount, which is based
28 on 75% of the existing rate.

1 Funding will be adjusted if Medicaid services are accessed for
2 residential services for the developmentally disabled in order that the new
3 rate will be comparable to rates for similar services.

4
5 SECTION 24. Funds allocated under this Appropriation for community
6 based services, for Grants-in-Aid, being item (1) of Section 9 herein, shall
7 be used only to provide services through private community based services
8 licensed or certified by the Arkansas Division of Developmental Disabilities
9 Services. When DDS licensed providers are involved in delivering services
10 which are Medicaid reimbursable, they must enroll as a provider with the
11 Arkansas Medicaid Program and must bill the Arkansas Medicaid Program for all
12 covered services for eligible individuals.

13 Services which are covered by the Arkansas State Medicaid Program or
14 under the Alternative Community Services Waiver Program (ACS) or the Nursing
15 Home Waiver will be utilized to the maximum extent possible for any individual
16 who is eligible for Medicaid coverage prior to any expenditure of general
17 revenue, other than for Medicaid matching funds, or Title XX. It is the
18 intent of this section that DDS, as a general policy, maximize the use of
19 Medicaid funding available for services.

20 The State shall require each provider funded from this Appropriation for
21 community based services, including funding from the Grants/Patient Services
22 Line, being item (7) of Section 3 herein, the Early Intervention Line, being
23 item (10) of Section 3 herein or from the Grants-In-Aid Line, being item (1)
24 of Section 9 herein, to screen each individual to whom services are provided
25 for a determination of eligibility or ineligibility for Medicaid coverage
26 within thirty days of the first date that services are provided. It is the
27 intent of this section to insure that wherever possible, Medicaid funds are
28 utilized for covered or waived services to individuals who are eligible for
29 coverage under the Arkansas Medicaid Program or the ACS or Nursing Home
30 Waivers.

31 Nothing in this Act shall prevent the Division or any provider from
32 extending emergency services in a timely manner.

33
34 SECTION 25. The Office of Long Term Care (OLTC) shall promulgate and
35 maintain, pursuant to the requirements of the Arkansas Administrative

1 *Procedures Act, separate regulations, client rights and sanctions for ICF/MR*
2 *operations and for other long term care facilities regulated by the OLTC.*
3 *Regulations which cover all facilities regulated by OLTC shall be included in*
4 *each separate set of regulations. Changes and updates to each set of*
5 *regulations shall specify which type of regulations are being updated or*
6 *changed.*

7
8 *SECTION 26. The operation of the community based ICF/MR program will be*
9 *subject to the oversight of a five member sub-committee comprised of three*
10 *House members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives*
11 *and two Senate members to be appointed by the President Pro Tem of the Senate.*
12 *The committee shall provide oversight for the operation of the small ICF/MR*
13 *program and make recommendations, within the appropriate Federal Regulations*
14 *and Guidelines, to DDS and OLTC to establish and clarify the mission, goals,*
15 *levels of services and scope of the program and to provide consistency in*
16 *state regulations, guidelines, standards and policies. The sub-committee*
17 *shall also make recommendations for adequate funding to insure the fiscal*
18 *integrity of the program to allow it to be operated pursuant to the state and*
19 *federal regulations, guidelines, standards and policies.*

20
21 *SECTION 27. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds*
22 *authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency*
23 *and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and*
24 *the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and*
25 *Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary*
26 *Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control*
27 *laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the*
28 *Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be*
29 *strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.*

30
31 *SECTION 28. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General*
32 *Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations*
33 *contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which*
34 *this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive*
35 *Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget*

1 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
2 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
3 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

4
5 SECTION 29. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and
6 permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and
7 the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

8
9 SECTION 30. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
10 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
11 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
12 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
13 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

14
15 SECTION 31. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
16 with this Act are hereby repealed.

17
18 SECTION 32. HEALTH PREMIUMS. The Department of Human Services -
19 Division of Developmental Disabilities Services shall not, during the 1992-93
20 fiscal year, spend more for health insurance per employee than the amount
21 being contributed to the State Employees Health Insurance Program.

22
23 SECTION 33. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
24 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of
25 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year
26 period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the
27 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided,
28 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the
29 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm
30 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
31 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
32 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
33 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
