For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND
9 OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE OUACHITA TECHNICAL COLLEGE FOR
10 THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 1993; AND FOR OTHER
11 PURPOSES."

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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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15 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the
16 Ouachita Technical College, to be payable from the Ouachita Technical College
17 Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Ouachita Technical
18 College for the biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the following:

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35 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated,
36 to the Ouachita Technical College, to be payable from cash funds as defined by

1 Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Ouachita Technical College, for personal
 2 services and operating expenses of the Ouachita Technical College for the
 3 biennial period ending June 30, 1993, the following:

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24 SECTION 3. FUND CREATED. There is hereby established on the books of the
 25 State Treasurer, State Auditor and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to
 26 be known as the Ouachita Technical College Fund, there to be used for the
 27 maintenance, operation and improvement of the Ouachita Technical College. The
 28 fund shall consist of :

- 29 (A) Such general revenues as may be provided by law; and
 30 (B) Any other funds made available for the support of the Ouachita
 31 Technical College which are required to be deposited into the State Treasury
 32 by law.

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34 SECTION 4. PRIORITIES. A high priority of the Ouachita Technical College
 35 shall be the combatting of illiteracy and the providing of industrial
 36 training, in the work place.

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SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 7. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 9. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the

1 Seventy-Eighth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of
2 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year
3 period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1991 is essential to the
4 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided,
5 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the
6 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1991 could work irreparable harm
7 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
8 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
9 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
10 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
