For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE SEVENTY-EIGHTH SESSION PROJECTS
9 ACCOUNT WITHIN THE GENERAL IMPROVEMENT FUND; TO DEFINE THE
10 MONIES TO BE AVAILABLE IN SUCH ACCOUNT; AND TO DEFINE THE
11 PURPOSES FOR WHICH MONIES MAY BE MADE AVAILABLE FROM THE
12 GENERAL IMPROVEMENT FUND; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

13

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

15

16 SECTION 1. There is hereby created and established on the books of the
17 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the State Treasurer and the State Auditor,
18 the "78th Session Projects Account" within the "General Improvement Fund",
19 into which shall be transferred and credited the respective monies as
20 hereinafter provided in this Act, to be used for providing financing, in the
21 manner set forth herein, for the various projects and purposes enumerated in
22 this Act to be financed from said account.

23 Immediately upon the effective date of this Act, or as soon thereafter
24 as is practical, the State Treasurer shall transfer and credit to the "78th
25 Session Projects Account" of the "General Improvement Fund", upon
26 certification of the amounts thereof by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State,
27 the following:

28 (a) all unobligated and unallocated monies remaining in the "General
29 Improvement Fund" which are not required to finance projects to be financed
30 therefrom pursuant to appropriations enacted by the 77th General Assembly, or
31 which have not been reappropriated or reallocated for financing from the
32 "General Improvement Fund" by the 78th General Assembly.

33 (b) any unobligated or unallocated funds remaining in the "General
34 Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund" from monies accruing thereto during the 1989-
35 91 fiscal biennium which are not required to finance enactments of the 78th
36 General Assembly that do not expire on June 30, 1991.

1 (c) for the period commencing July 1, 1991 and ending June 30, 1993,
2 the State Treasurer shall, after complying with provisions of (1) Arkansas
3 Code 27-70-204 for distributing interest income earned from investment of
4 average daily balances of the "State Highway and Transportation Department
5 Fund"; (2) Arkansas Code 15-41-110 for distributing interest earned from
6 investment of average daily balances of the "Game Protection Fund"; (3) the
7 first two million dollars (\$2,000,000) of interest income received each fiscal
8 year by the State Treasurer as authorized in Arkansas Code 15-5-422; and (4)
9 the next one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) of interest income received
10 each fiscal year by the State Treasurer as authorized in Arkansas Code 20-78-
11 504; credit to the "Budget Stabilization Trust Fund" or its successor fund,
12 fifty percent (50%) of the interest income received and credited to the
13 "Securities Reserve Fund", and credit to the "78th Session Projects Account"
14 fifty percent (50%) of the interest income received and credited to the
15 "Securities Reserve Fund" as certified by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
16 State, that is required to provide financing to the "78th Session Projects
17 Account," until there has been credited an amount required, which when added
18 to the other funds available for such purposes will finance each of the
19 projects or purposes hereinafter enumerated.

20
21 SECTION 2. (A) From the monies accruing to the benefit of the "78th
22 Session Projects Account" of the "General Improvement Fund" as authorized by
23 Section 1 of this Act, the Governor may direct the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
24 State to effectuate an allocation of monies for financing certain
25 appropriation and transfers of monies as authorized by the 78th General
26 Assembly as follows:

25 In the event all of the allocations of monies for any of the purposes or
 26 projects listed above cannot be made due to the inadequacy of required
 27 matching monies, the Governor is hereby authorized to defer to a later time,
 28 such allocations and then proceed to authorize allocations of monies in
 29 accordance with the provisions of paragraph (B) of this Section. Such
 30 allocations of monies previously deferred, may be authorized by the Governor
 31 at any time after complying with the matching requirements.

32 (B)After financing is provided for the purposes and projects enumerated
 33 in Subsection (A) herein; from the remaining monies accruing to the benefit of
 34 the "78th Session Projects Account" of the "General Improvement Fund" as

34 SECTION 3. (A) In the event monies are not available or are estimated

35 not to become available to fully finance all of the projects for which

1 allocations are provided in Subsection (A) of Section 2 of this Act, the
2 Governor shall notify the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the Arkansas
3 Legislative Council of the projects in Subsection (A) of Section 2 of this Act
4 for which financing shall be made available, and shall specify the projects
5 for which funding is approved and the priorities to be followed in providing
6 funds for each such project.

7 (B) In the event sufficient monies are not available or are estimated
8 not to become available to fully finance all of the projects for which
9 allocations are provided in Subsection (B) of Section 2 of this Act, the
10 Governor shall notify the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the Arkansas
11 Legislative Council of the projects in Subsection (B) of Section 2 of this Act
12 for which financing shall be made available, and shall specify the projects
13 for which funding is approved and the priorities to be followed in providing
14 funds for each such project.

15 (C) In the event sufficient monies are not available or are estimated
16 not to become available to fully finance all of the projects for which
17 allocations are provided in Subsection (C) of Section 2 of this Act, the
18 Governor shall notify the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the Arkansas
19 Legislative Council of the projects in Subsection (C) of Section 2 of this Act
20 for which financing shall be made available, and shall specify the projects
21 for which funding is approved and the priorities to be followed in providing
22 funds for each such project.

23

24 SECTION 4. Any enactment of the 78th General Assembly appropriating or
25 allocating funds to be payable from the "General Improvement Fund", for which
26 a specific allocation of funds is authorized in Section 2 of this Act, shall
27 be deemed to be payable from the "78th Session Projects Account" within the
28 "General Improvement Fund" unless a specific intent is otherwise provided by
29 law. Provided that monies reappropriated by the 78th General Assembly for
30 projects for which appropriations were made by the 77th General Assembly,
31 which are not enumerated in this Act and which are made payable from the
32 "General Improvement Fund", shall be payable from the "77th Session Projects
33 Account" of the "General Improvement Fund" and allowances shall be made
34 therefore in arriving at the uncommitted and unobligated balance of monies in
35 the "General Improvement Fund" and allowances shall be made therefore in

1 arriving at the uncommitted and unobligated balance of monies in the "General
2 Improvement Fund" before making transfers therefrom to the "78th Session
3 Projects Account", as authorized by this Act.

4
5 SECTION 5. Beginning August 1, 1991, and each month thereafter, the
6 Director of the Department of Correction shall certify to the Chief Fiscal
7 Officer of the State the amount of monies owed for reimbursement by the
8 Department of Correction to counties housing prisoners sentenced to the
9 Department of Correction. Upon certification by the Director of the
10 Department of Correction to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the State
11 Treasurer shall cause to be transferred from the General Improvement Fund, to
12 the County Jail Reimbursement Fund, the amount of monies certified as owed for
13 reimbursement to counties by the Department of Correction. In no event,
14 however, shall the State Treasurer transfer from the General Improvement Fund,
15 to the County Jail Reimbursement Fund, more than six million two hundred
16 thirty one thousand six hundred twenty dollars (\$6,231,620) during the 1991-93
17 biennium.

18
19 SECTION 6. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
20 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
21 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

22
23 SECTION 7. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
24 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
25 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
26 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
27 end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

28
29 SECTION 8. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
30 with this Act are hereby repealed.

31
32 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined that
33 the 78th General Assembly of the State of Arkansas has considered and enacted
34 appropriations for construction projects, and other programs to be financed
35 from the accumulated surplus and reserve funds available in the State Treasury

1 and that the immediate passage of this Act is necessary to establish a method
2 of providing for the orderly financing and a system of priority for the
3 financing of such projects. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to
4 exist, and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
5 public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and
6 after its passage and approval.
