HOUSE BILL 1075

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 6-14-111 TO PROVIDE FOR
9 WRITE-IN CANDIDATES IN SCHOOL ELECTIONS; AND FOR OTHER
10 PURPOSES."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

14 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 6-14-111 is amended to read as follows:

15 "6-14-111. Ballots.

16 (a) The county board of election commissioners shall prepare and
17 furnish ballots and all other necessary supplies for the annual school
18 election.

19 (b) The county board of election commissioners shall place on the
20 ballots, as candidates for school district director or member of the county
21 board of education, names of any qualified voters whose names have been
22 presented to the board by petition of at least twenty (20) qualified
23 registered voters, residents of the respective districts or zones, at least
24 forty-five (45) days before the annual school election.

25 (c) Votes for a write-in candidate for school district director or
26 member of the county board of education shall not be counted or tabulated
27 unless, not later than forty (40) days before the annual school election, the
28 candidate notifies in writing the county board of election commissioners of
29 his or her intention to be a write-in candidate."

30
31 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
32 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
33 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

34
35 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
36 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect

1 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
2 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
3 act are declared to be severable.

5 SECTION 4. All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this act are
6 hereby repealed.
