For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE USE OF SOYBEAN INK IN STATE
9 PRINTING; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

13 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary,
14 all printing which is chargeable to, or which is paid for with funds
15 appropriated wholly or in part by the state, or any state department,
16 division, bureau, board, commission or agency, shall be printed in soybean
17 ink; provided, however, that the soybean ink is comparable in price to other
18 inks and that it is equally suitable for use.

19

20 SECTION 2. The use of soybean ink shall be phased-in over a period of
21 three (3) years so that within one (1) year after the effective date of this
22 act fifty percent (50%) of applicable printing shall use soybean ink; within
23 two (2) years after the effective date of this act seventy-five percent (75%)
24 of applicable printing shall use soybean ink; and within three (3) years after
25 the effective date of this act one hundred percent (100%) of applicable
26 printing shall use soybean ink.

28 SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
29 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
30 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

31

32 SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
33 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
34 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
35 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
36 act are declared to be severable.
