1 State of Arkansas **A BillACT 645 OF 1991** 2 78th General Assembly HOUSE BILL 1894 3 Regular Session, 1991 By: Representative Teague 5 6 For An Act To Be Entitled 7 "AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 14, CHAPTER 164, SUBCHAPTER 3 OF g THE ARKANSAS CODE OF 1987 ANNOTATED; TO AUTHORIZE 9 MUNICIPALITIES AND COUNTIES TO FINANCE ECONOMIC 10 DEVELOPMENT FACILITIES, EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES, AND MUSEUM 11 RELATED AUDIOVISUAL FACILITIES BY THE USE OF BONDS; TO 12 PERMIT THE ABOLITION OF THE LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX LEVIED 13 14 PURSUANT TO SUCH SUBCHAPTER; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND 15 FOR OTHER PURPOSES." 16 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 18 Subparagraph (2) of Section 14-164-303(a) of the Arkansas 19 SECTION 1. Code of 1987 Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows: 2.0 21 'Capital improvements of a public nature' or 'capital improvements' for the purposes of Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 62 and this subchapter means, whether obtained by purchase, lease, construction, reconstruction, restoration, improvement, alteration, repair, or other means: 2.4 25 (A) Any physical public betterment or improvement or any 26 preliminary plans, studies, or surveys relative thereto; 27 (B) Land or rights in land, including, without limitation, 28 leases, air rights, easements, rights-of-way, or licenses; and (C) Any furnishings, machinery, vehicles, apparatus, or equipment 29 30 for any public betterment or improvement, which shall include, without 31 limiting the generality of the foregoing definition, the following: City or 32 town halls, courthouses, and administrative, executive, or other public 33 offices; court facilities; jails; police and sheriff stations, apparatus, and

34 facilities; firefighting facilities and apparatus; public health facilities

36 facilities for nonprofit organizations engaged primarily in public health,

35 and apparatus; hospitals, nursing homes, and similar extended-care facilities;

1 health systems support, safety, disaster relief, and related activities; 2 residential housing for low and moderate income, elderly, or handicapped 3 persons and families; parking facilities and garages; educational facilities; 4 economic development facilities; educationand training facilities for public 5 employees; auditoriums; stadiums; convention, meeting, or entertainment 6 facilities; ambulance and other emergency medical service facilities; civil 7 defense facilities; air and water pollution control facilities; drainage and 8 flood control facilities; storm sewers; arts and crafts centers; museums and 9 related audiovisual facilities; libraries; public parks, playgrounds, or other 10 public open space; marinas; swimming pools, tennis courts, golf courses, 11 camping facilities, gymnasiums, and other recreational facilities; tourist 12 information and assistance centers; historical, cultural, natural, or folklore 13 sites; fair and exhibition facilities; streets and street lighting, alleys, 14 sidewalks, roads, bridges, and viaducts; airports, passenger or freight 15 terminals, hangars, and related facilities; barge terminals, ports, harbors, 16 ferries, wharves, docks, and similar marine services; slack water harbors, 17 water resource facilities, waterfront development facilities, and navigational 18 facilities; public transportation facilities; public water systems and related 19 transmission and distribution facilities, storage facilities, wells, 20 impounding reservoirs, treatment plants, lakes, dams, watercourses, and water 21 rights; sewage collection systems and treatment plants; maintenance and 22 storage buildings and facilities; incinerators; garbage and solid waste 23 collection disposal, compacting, and recycling facilities of every kind; 24 facilities for the generation, transmission, and distribution of television 25 communications; gas and electric generation, transmission, and distribution 26 systems, including without limiting the generality of the foregoing, 27 hydroelectric generating facilities, dams, powerhouses, and related 28 facilities; and social and rehabilitative service facilities." 29 30 SECTION 2. Subparagraph (1) of Section 14-164-329(c) of the Arkansas 31 Code of 1987 Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows: If bonds are issued, thetax shall be abolished when there 32 "(1) 33 are no bonds outstanding to which such tax collections are pledged as provided 34 in this subchapter. If bonds have not been issued, the tax shall be abolished

35 when it is determined by a roll call vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all the

1 members elected to the municipality's or county's governing body that the 2 bonds approved by the voters shall not be issued. Bonds shall not be deemed 3 to be outstanding hereunder if the trustee for the bondholders provides the 4 certificate provided for in subdivision 5 (c)(2)(A) of this section." SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 8 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 9 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 10 11 SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 12 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 13 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 14 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 15 act are declared to be severable. 16 SECTION 5. All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this act are 17 18 hereby repealed. 19 20 SECTION 6. Emergency. It has been found and it is hereby declared that 21 certain municipalities in this state cannot finance educational facilities, 22 economic development facilities, and museum related audiovisual facilities at 23 affordable costs except by the use of bonds as authorized hereby. It has been 24 further found and determined that the provisions of Title 14, Chapter 164, 25 Subchapter 3 of the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated authorizing the levy of a 26 local sales and use tax by municipalities and counties are in need of 27 clarification as regards the authority of the governing bodies of such 28 counties and municipalities to abolish such taxes in certain situations. 29 Therefore, an emergency is declared and this act, being necessary for the 30 public peace, health and safety, shall be in full force from and after its 31 passage and approval. 32 33 APPROVED: 3-19-91 34

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
