7 **For An Act To Be Entitled**

8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARK. CODE ANN. §7-5-104 TO PROVIDE FOR
9 THE MANNER IN WHICH ELECTION EXPENSES ARE ALLOCATED; AND
10 FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

14 SECTION 1. Ark. Code Ann. §7-5-104 is hereby amended to read as
15 follows:

16 "7-5-104. Election expenses - Allocation.

17 All expenses of general or special elections for Presidential,
18 congressional, state, district, county, township, or municipal offices in this
19 state shall be paid by the counties in which they are held. However, any city,
20 incorporated town, or school district shall reimburse the county board of
21 election commissioners for the expenses of any election in an amount equal to
22 a figure derived by dividing the total cost of the election by a fraction, the
23 numerator of which shall be the number of voters from the city, incorporated
24 town or school district casting ballots in the election prepared by the county
25 board of election commissioners and the denominator of which shall be the
26 total number of voters casting ballots in the election."

28 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
29 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
30 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

31

32 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
33 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
34 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
35 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
36 act are declared to be severable.
