HOUSE BILL 1981

For An Act To Be Entitled

8 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 20-9-908 TO ADD A NEW
9 SUBSECTION TO PROVIDE A CARRY FORWARD PROVISION FOR
10 APPLICATION FEES IN THE UTILIZATION REVIEW PROGRAM; AND
11 FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

14 "AN ACT TO PROVIDE CARRY FORWARD FOR FEES IN UTILIZATION
15 REVIEW."

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

19 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 20-9-908 is amended by adding a new subsection
20 to read as follows:

21 "(d) All application fees shall be special revenues and deposited to
22 the credit of the Public Health Fund. Any unexpended balance of such fees at
23 the end of each state fiscal year shall be carried forward to the next fiscal
24 year to be used for the same intent and purposes as set forth in this
25 subchapter."

27 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent
28 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
29 Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

31 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
32 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
33 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
34 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
35 act are declared to be severable.

1 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
2 hereby repealed.

3

4 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
5 Assembly that a carry forward provision should apply to application fees in
6 the utilization review program for the effective administration of the
7 program. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act
8 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
9 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and
10 approval.
