1 State of Arkansas A Bill **ACT 1134 OF 1993** 2 **79th General Assembly** HOUSE BILL 2137 3 Regular Session, 1993 **By: Joint Budget Committee** 6 For An Act To Be Entitled 7 "AN ACT TO MAKE A REAPPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF R FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION - DISBURSING OFFICER AND TO 9 PROVIDE FOR A TRANSFER OF ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO BE USED TO 10 11 CREATE VARIOUS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ENHANCEMENTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES." 12 13 Subtitle 14 15 "AN ACT TO MAKE A REAPPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION - DISBURSING OFFICER-AEROSPACE." 17 18 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 20 SECTION 1. REAPPROPRIATION - AVIATION AND AEROSPACE INDUSTRY 22 DEVELOPMENT. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Finance and 23 Administration - Disbursing Officer, to be payable from the Aerospace and 24 Industry Development Fund for the Department of Finance and Administration -25 Disbursing Officer, the following: (A) Effective July 1, 1993, the balance of the appropriation provided in 26 27 Section 1 of Act 21 of the First Extraordinary Session of 1992, for the 28 purpose of providing economic development and enhancement of the aviation and 29 aerospace industry in the State of Arkansas, a sum not to exceed..\$10,000,000. 3.0 31 SECTION 2. FUNDS TRANSFERRED. Upon direction by the Governor and upon 32 certification from time to time by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the 33 State Treasurer shall transfer from the General Revenue Fund Account of the 34 State Apportionment Fund, an amount not to exceed ten million dollars 35 (\$10,000,000) during the biennial period ending June 30, 1995, to the 36 Aerospace and Industry Development Fund for the purpose of creating various

1 economic development enhancements in the aviation and aerospace industry in 2 Arkansas, provided however not more than \$4,000,000 may be transferred prior 3 to June 30, 1994. Funding not to exceed \$4,000,000 may be transferred prior 4 to June 30, 1994 if the Governor determines that such funds are necessary to 5 secure the location or expansion of projects eligible for funding under this If on June 30, 1994, net general revenue available for distribution 7 exceeds funding of 48% of the "B" allotment of the Revenue Stabilization Act, 8 A.C.A. § 19-5-402 (b), an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000 or the amount by 9 which net general revenue available for distribution exceeds 48% of "B" 10 allotment of said Revenue Stabilization Act, whichever is less, may be 11 transferred to the fund. During the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, no funds may be transferred 12 13 unless the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State has provided a forecast of net 14 general revenue available for distribution that exceeds funding of 55.34% of 15 the "B" allotment of the Revenue Stabilization Act, A.C.A. § 19-5-404 (b), for 16 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995 by a minimum of \$10,000,000, except that 17 funding not to exceed \$4,000,000 may be transferred if the Governor determines 18 that such funds are necessary to secure the location or expansion of projects 19 eligible for funding under this Act. Provided however, that in no event may 20 more than a total of \$10,000,000 be transferred during the biennium ending 21 June 30, 1995. 22 SECTION 3. Funds appropriated in Section 1 may only be disbursed upon 23 24 the recommendation of the Arkansas Aviation and Aerospace Commission or the 25 Arkansas Industrial Development Commission. Such funds may be utilized for 26 construction, reconstruction, demolition, site development, transportation, 27 contracts and related costs associated with the creation, expansion, and 28 rehabilitation of water or sewer systems, streets and roads, bridges, 29 drainage, additional support for disease control centers and other vital 30 public facilities, or to provide training or retraining of the workforce to 31 new or existing industry located in the State of Arkansas. Use of the funds 32 for such training shall be limited to training where no other existing 33 education or training program is capable of meeting the specific training

34 needs of the aviation and aerospace industry. The public purpose must be 35 certified by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. Provided, however, that

1 before any funds are disbursed under the provisions of this Act, the Chief 2 Fiscal Officer of the State shall promulgate such rules and regulations as may 3 be needed to ensure that any recipient shall contribute to the economy of this 4 State consistent with the intents of this Act. SECTION 4. It is the intent of the 79th General Assembly meeting in 7 Regular Session that the financing of the aerospace and industrial development 8 program through a transfer from the State Apportionment Fund is not to be a 9 precedent in financing programs in this state. We recognize that an unusual 10 and possibly unique situation exists that requires the General Assembly to 11 deviate from its normal practice of establishing priorities and allowing the 12 programs to receive financing through the Arkansas Revenue Stabilization Law. It is our intent to provide any financial support for the program contained 14 in this Act in the future, if any, through the process of it receiving a share 15 of the distribution of the "general revenues available for allocation" in the 16 Arkansas Revenue Stabilization Law. 17 SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 18 19 authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 20 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 21 the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 22 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 23 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control 24 laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the 25 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 26 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 27 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 2.8 29 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 30 contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which 31 this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 32 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 33 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 34 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 35 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

2	SECTION 7. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent
3	nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas
4	Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
5	
6	SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the
7	application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
8	invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which
9	can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
10	end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.
11	
12	SECTION 9. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict
13	with this Act are hereby repealed.
14	
15	SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
16	Seventy-Ninth General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
17	prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
18	previous General Assemblies have provided appropriations for the projects
19	provided enumerated in this act; that certain appropriations will expire
20	before the adjournment of the General Assembly; and that if such
21	appropriations expire, the projects and programs authorized herein will cease
22	thereby depriving the citizens of the State of the benefits to be derived from
23	such projects. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this
24	Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,
25	health, and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its
26	passage and approval.
