18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

20	SECTION 1. Subchapter 3 of chapter 92 of title 17 of Arkansas Code is
21	amended by adding the following section:
22	"17-92-310. (a) It is unlawful for a physical therapist or any of his
23	business associates to engage, directly or indirectly, in the division,
24	transferring, assigning, rebating or refunding of gratuities or fees received
25	for professional services with any person who referred a patient or with any
26	relative or business associate of the referring person.
27	(b) This section shall not apply to any physical therapist employed by
28	a licensed physician or a group physician practice when the physical therapy
29	services are performed within the same office, building, clinic or physical
30	facility as the referring physician's services are performed nor shall it
31	apply to physical therapy positions on the premises of Arkansas licensed
32	hospitals and nursing homes."
33	
34	SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
35	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
36	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

2	SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
3	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
4	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
5	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
6	act are declared to be severable.

8	SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
9	hereby repealed.
